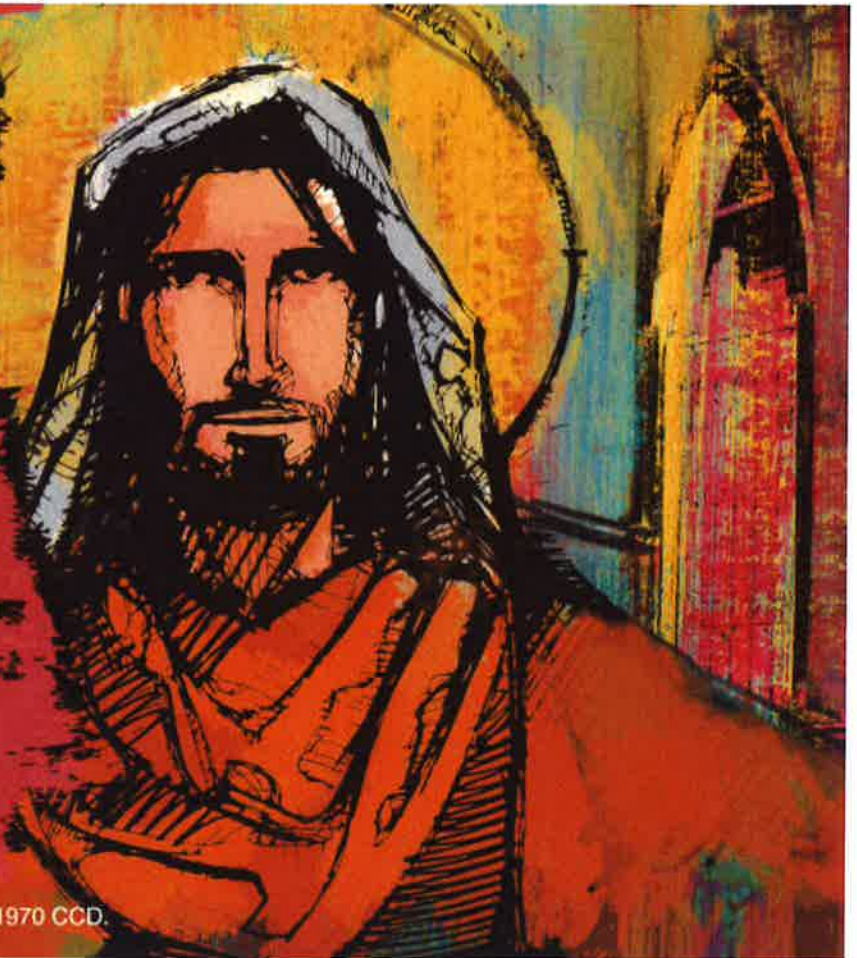

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Active and contemplative. At work and at rest. These are dynamics we all face in our lives, and if we're honest, we might not always balance perfectly! In this Sunday's Gospel, our daily tensions play out in two sisters. Mary "sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak." Martha, on the other hand, is "burdened with much serving." This, as it turns out, is not necessarily "the better part."

All of us reading this have some sort of labor we engage in. We have different trades or careers. We have responsibilities as family members, some of which may take up most of our time. In the time of Scripture, showing hospitality to guests was one of the most important values in society. Our work is important. Jesus himself spent decades as a carpenter. So what's the problem with Martha? Martha is burdened, anxious, and worried. Not only that, but she resents her sister's choice. "Tell her to help me," she demands of Jesus.

How easy it is to get very busy doing good things. We need to provide for our families and plan for retirement. We need to make sure children are clothed, fed, and educated. Our committees, ministries, and sports schedules need to stay on track. However, without a balance of work with rest, without contemplation in the midst of our action, we will miss the point. While many parts are required for our life in the world to function, the better part is our relationship with God. This week, make time in your busy schedule to sit at Jesus' feet. Maybe this is 20 minutes with Scripture, participating in a daily Mass, or a quiet walk alone in the park. Receive what Christ wants to speak to you.

Fr. Ray's Book Review

Chapter Three of Rejoice and Be Glad is the main chapter of Pope Francis' exhortation. Jesus explained with great simplicity what it means to be holy when he gave us the Beatitudes, and it is the Beatitudes which should be a Christian identity card. In the Beatitudes we find a portrait of the Master, which we are called to reflect in our daily lives. The word "happy" or "blessed" thus becomes a synonym for "holy." Even if we find Jesus' message attractive, the world pushes us towards another way of living.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Where do we find our security in life? The world tells us the rich are secure. Wealth assures nothing. Once we think we are rich, we can become self satisfied and we have no room for God's word, for the love of our brothers and sisters, or for the enjoyment of what is most important in life. Spiritual poverty is "holy indifference" which brings about true interior freedom. If we live a plain and austere life we might be more open to help those in need.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. These are strong words in a world that from the beginning has been a place of conflict, disputes and enmity on all sides. If we are constantly upset and impatient with others, we will be drained and weary. Perfect charity consists in putting up with other's mistakes, and not being scandalized by their faults.

He received permission to become a hermit. His reputation for holiness, however, led to a busier life than he might have liked! Many people sought him for advice and blessings. Early Christian art frequently depict the saints and others standing in this posture, offering their prayers and surrendering themselves, with hands uplifted to the Lord, in a gesture that echoes Christ's outstretched arms as he offered himself on the Cross.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained...

July 22 is the feast of Mary Magdalene. I've heard a lot of stories about her, but who was she really?

Mary Magdalene has been the subject of speculation and scholarship over the last 2,000 years. Mary Magdalene makes her first named appearance in Luke 8:2. She is one of several women following Jesus. Luke specifically mentions that Mary had previously been delivered from demonic possession. Whatever her life looked like before she met Jesus, it wasn't good! Because of this association with being a repentant sinner, Mary Magdalene has been associated with other similar stories in the Gospel, such as the woman caught in adultery or the woman who bathes Jesus' feet with her tears.

Mary Magdalene shows up again by name at the end of the Gospels, when she stands with the Blessed Virgin Mary at the foot of the Cross. Mary is also present in the garden of the resurrection. She is one of the woman who goes to bring spices to Jesus' tomb, where they find the stone rolled away. Mary stays in the garden weeping, believing his body has been stolen. Jesus approaches her and calls her by name, and she becomes the first witness to the resurrection! While many of the details of Mary Magdalene's life have been lost to time, she is an example of powerful conversion, deep faith, and intimate love for Christ.
