17th Sunday in Ordinary Time Are you guilty of spiritual stockpiling? Spiritual stockpiling isn't an endless rotation of rosaries and novenas. It's accumulating emotional "goods" to meet your needs. Perhaps it's a collection of material objects you treasure. Maybe it's a preoccupation with money. It could also be relationships, making sure there's always enough friends and connections to never really feel alone. It's our tendency to let things add up so that we won't quite need God to fulfill our inner life. Yet in this Sunday's Gospel, we have that inescapable petition from the Our Father. "Give us each day our daily bread."

This life isn't an immediate arrival. And as much as we might try to shore up possessions and pleasures, we know the journey is unpredictable. Give us this day our daily bread implies enough for the next set of steps, but not enough to stockpile. So here's the big question: Do we trust God to give us what we need? After all, "What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish?... how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" At the Last Supper, Jesus said he would never leave us orphaned. God will not abandon us. And surely He wouldn't ask us to pray for what He does not intend to give.

Of course, sometimes our prayers for daily help can seem to go unanswered. Today's Gospel has advice for that, too. "I tell you... he will give up to him whatever he needs because of his persistence." Our spiritual stockpiling increases our self-reliance and decreases our openness to God's possibilities. Be persistent in your pursuit of God! Trust that He will keep His promises to provide for us, today and always.

Fr. Ray's Book Review

As we continue to look at Chapter Three of *Rejoice and Be Glad*, we now examine: Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. The world tells us that entertainment, pleasure, diversions and escape make for the good life. The worldly person ignores problems of sickness or sorrow in the family or all around him. The world has no desire to mourn. A person who is able to see things as they truly are and is sympathetic with pain and sorrow, is capable of touching life's depths and finding authentic happiness. The world cannot give consolation, but Jesus can. Knowing how to mourn with others is a sign of holiness.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Jesus offers a justice other than that of the world, so often marred by petty interests and manipulated in various ways. True justice comes about in people's lives when they are just in their decisions; it is expressed in their pursuit of justice for the poor and the weak.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. Mercy has two aspects. It involves giving, helping and serving others, but it also includes forgiveness and understanding. Giving and forgiving means reproducing in our lives some small measure of God's perfection. We need to think of ourselves as an army of the forgiving, for all of us have been looked upon with divine compassion.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

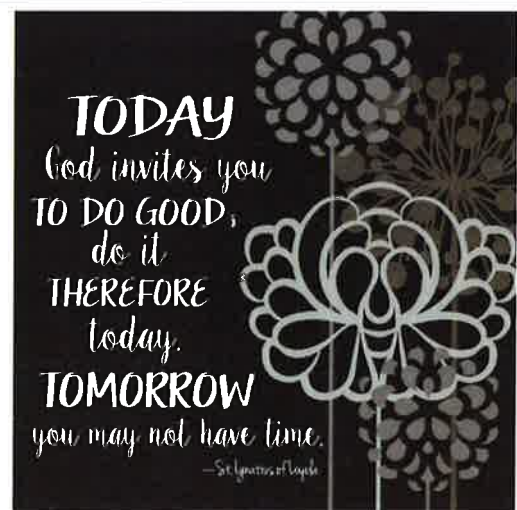
Stations of the Cross will be held every Friday at 5:30 pm. Everyone is invited to join in this prayerful devotion.

PRAYING WITH BODY, MIND, AND VOICE

Prostrating In this rarely used posture, an individual lies full-length on the floor, face to the ground. A posture of deep humility, it signifies our willingness to share in Christ's death so as to share in his Resurrection (see Rom 6). It is used at the beginning of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday and also during the Litany of the Saints in the Rite of Ordination, when those to be ordained deacons, priests, and bishops prostrate themselves in humble prayer and submission to Christ.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained...

I've heard that love is a theological virtue. What does that mean?

Charles Shultz, the creator of the Peanuts comics wrote, "I love mankind... it's people I can't stand!" This good humored comment gets at an important truth. St. John wrote a very strong statement in one of his letters: "If anyone says 'I love God,' but hates his brother, he is a liar; for whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen" (1 John 4:20). How often do we say "I love the homeless," but ignore the parish food drive? Or insist on the importance of respecting others, but don't bother to say hello to our cashier? If we can't love an individual person, we might not love people like we think, and we certainly need to work on our love for God.

Love is "the theological virtue by which we love God above all things for His own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God" (CCC 1822). God knows acts of love of Him and others isn't always easy. So He invites us to pray for the grace to do it. The virtue of love gives us the grace and strength we need to offer our lives to God and love people in our lives, especially those who are difficult to respect, tolerate, and care for. Real love, of course, is risky. Real love wills the good of the other when we just want good for ourselves. Real love gets up on the cross when we'd prefer to take a nap in Gethsemane. Real love changes things.
