Tickets booked, packing list double-checked, itinerary set - how do you know you're prepared for a trip? Being ready requires plenty of practical preparation. Do we give the same care to our spiritual preparedness? "Your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom," Jesus tells us. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus reminds us to have the right attitude for the gifts and callings he wants to give us!

Clear out your clutter! "Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." Jesus reminds the disciples that earthly standards of security and success will wear out in time. If our lives are structured around values that don't align with the kingdom of God, we'll miss opportunities to receive God. If we're so concerned with our child's success in sports that we miss Sunday Mass for their tournaments, we're missing out receiving the sacraments and building a consistent community of faith. If our quest for the promotion takes us away from family commitments, we won't be able to fully receive the love intended in our closest relationships. Set faith-based priorities. "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival." Our conflicting commitments can cause any routine to slip from time to time. All the more reason to make sure faith is a priority. Pray as a family before meals. Bring your children regularly to the sacrament of confession. Make room in the schedule for faith enrichment activities offered by your parish. Volunteer once a month. "At an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." When will the call come to care for an ailing parent? To take on a new leadership position? God speaks to us through the circumstances of our lives. He calls each of us to greater love, sometimes in very concrete ways. This week, take some time to consider: Will you be ready?

Fr. Ray's Book Review

Chapter Three of Rejoice and Be Glad concludes with an examination of what holiness is. It may not be someone who is given to mystical rapture. Rather, a holy person is one who can recognize Jesus in the poor and the suffering. Holiness is the ability to see a poor person and to respond to their needs with faith and charity, recognizing in this person a human being with a dignity identical to my own.

There are two harmful errors to be caution about. The first is the thought that you can divide your personal relationship with the Lord, from the need to help your neighbors. The second error is to uphold an ideal of holiness but ignore injustice in a world where some revel, spend with abandon and live for the latest consumer goods.

It is true that the primacy belongs to our relationship with God, but we cannot forget that the ultimate criterion on which our lives will be judged is what we have done for others. Prayer is most precious, for it nourishes a daily commitment to love. The best way to discern if our prayer is authentic is to judge to what extent our life is being transformed in the light of mercy. Those who really wish to give glory to God by their lives, who truly long to grow in holiness are called to be single-minded in their practice of works of mercy.

A sermon by her local bishop, St. Francis de Sales, led her to forgive the man responsible for her husband's death. Jane had a special concern for those affected by the unexpected. In 1610, Francis helped Jane found the Visitation Order of religious sisters, which became involved in active ministry to the sick and poor and in accepting women who had been rejected by other religious orders due to age or health. Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained...

I'd like to pray each day, but I can't seem to find the time. Do you have any suggestions?

There are a lot of different ways to incorporate prayer into your daily routine. Start small by setting aside 10 or 15 minutes at natural breaks in your day, like first thing in the morning, during your lunch hour or a child's nap time, or as the evening winds down just after you've brushed your teeth. Put your phone on do not disturb or in airplane mode and set a timer. That way, you won't be interrupted by others calling or texting - or by yourself checking the time! Pick a place to pray, and sit in the same spot every day. The routine of place can help with focus.

Start with something simple. Scripture is a great start. Pray a single psalm slowly and consider how it relates to your life. Look up the daily Mass Gospel reading on your phone and take the same approach. Take some time to pray for others. Tick off five intentions on your hand each day, or assign each day of the week to a specific person or area of need (i.e., on Mondays, remember the poor, on Tuesdays, pray for your parish, Wednesdays, your extended family). Remember to share honestly with God. Don't be afraid to speak to Him in your heart as you would a friend out loud. Love grows in real relationship.
