Twenty-Second Sunday of Ordinary Time Can you imagine if Jesus threw a party? From the wedding feast at Cana, we know he wouldn't let the wine run out. From this Sunday's Gospel, we know there would be quite a lively array of guests! We also knew who the most important people would be - everyone. Jesus advises throwing a party that turns everything upside down. Everyone should assume they're the least important attendee, and the guest list shouldn't include the neighborhood "who's who." Rather, we should go looking for "the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind" and hope they RSVP. Jesus describes a particular posture towards our own hospitality. Parties are about the other people. "Do not recline at table in the place of honor." How often can small talk become a one-upmanship of job promotions, home renovations, and our children's achievements? We've all been to parties where being the most interesting guest is the highest achievement. Yet so often, we know the best party guests are the ones who listen well to our stories. Whether we are guests or hosts, we have the opportunity to look on others with humility and awe. Parties are opportunities to serve. Jesus advises us to be careful who we invite "in case they might invite you back and you have repayment." Does Jesus literally mean we shouldn't invite our friends over? Of course not! But he does invite us to special consideration when we offer hospitality. When we invite people over to our home, what motivates us? Who we want to spend time with? Who we'd like to impress? These ultimately have only ourselves in mind. How about asking: Who could use some extra care right now? Who could benefit from a fun evening out? In other words, who can I serve?

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained...

What is the virtue of humility?

In many ways, humility is the foundation of the spiritual life. It's the virtue by which we know ourselves accurately in relation to God and others. Humility reminds us that we are not the center of the universe. We recognize that we are created beings, totally dependent on God. We are nothing apart from Him. The more we recognize this, the more we're able to open ourselves to God's grace working in our lives. The closer we grow to God, the more we can love others. Humility also recognizes that we're "on par," so to speak, with others. Made in the image and likeness of God, we are all equal in dignity.

Growth in humility is not an easy process. It can mean accepting the humiliations and embarrassing mistakes of our life, learning from them graciously, rather than ignoring them or blaming others. It also means responding to those in authority with respect. We can practice humility by not bulldozing ahead or assuming our opinion or way of doing things is always right. Consider asking yourself: "I wonder what so-and-so would think of this?" It's also important to remember that humility isn't only the opposite of pride. It's also the opposite of excessive self-debasement. We've all experienced the negative self-talk that ignores God's gifts in our lives and in our own person. True humility thanks God for His many gifts... and recognizes that He was the One to give them.

Fr. Ray's
Book Review

Having a guide to the Rosary helps to keep focused on praying the mysteries. Meditating on the mysteries is like praying the Gospels, every mystery can be found in the Bible. What makes this an outstanding guide is that Matt has included the actual words from the Bible using the Revised Standard Version Bible, Second Catholic Edition, so that you do not need to keep the Bible close by as you pray the rosary.

What makes this an even better guide to the rosary is that Matt has also included a page which he called "Insight" for each mystery. The "Insight" could come from Scripture or from a saint. For example the 5th Joyful Mystery has an "Insight" taken from St. Ambrose who wrote: "The finding of Jesus in the Temple prefigures his resurrection. Just as the confusion and fear Mary and Joseph experienced for three days when their son was missing gave way to joy at his finding, so the confusion and fear that the Apostles experienced on Good Friday gave way to joy when he rose from death three days later."

What makes this a most excellent guide to the rosary is that each mystery also has a "Personal Application." This is a section where Matt will share his ideas on how to live the particular mystery.

Finally what makes this a most outstanding guide to the rosary is that it is compact, but still easy to read so that you can take it anywhere you go. It also includes the prayers you will need to pray the rosary and some additional prayers that you can offer at any time.

Pick one up and be ready for the Month of October.
