"I tell you, there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents." - Lk 15:10

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.

Twenty-Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time "Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain?" In this Sunday's Gospel, we learn the context for the forthcoming parables about the lost and found. A great mixed crowd surrounds Jesus. The religious elite are present, along with all manner of local lowlifes. The Pharisees seem a bit upset that this wasn't the lecture series they were hoping for. Why would Jesus welcome sinners?

Jesus responds as if it's the most obvious thing in the world. "Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep... rejoice because I have found the coin that I lost? let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine... was lost, and has been found!" Each of the parables features a dramatic example. Of 99 sheep, one has gone astray. Of 10 coins, one has gone missing. The welcomed son has previously been a covetous scoundrel. Jesus' point to the Pharisees is clear. If the Gospel really is "good news," if our faith really has the power to save, why wouldn't we want everyone drawing near? Why wouldn't we do everything in our power to eke out that possibility for every single person, no matter where they have wandered? After all, if this message is not of value to everyone, why is it of value to anyone?

Our Christian faith is not a matter of rule adherence for the perfectionist elite. In our own ways, each of us is the lost sheep, the prodigal son. There is no one who "has no need of repentance." The Church is a mixed crowd. And we are mixed people. And the Gospel has good news for each of us today! There is no one Jesus doesn't go after, no one he does not catch sight of "while... still a long way off," no one to whom he does not run to embrace and welcome home.

Welcome! It is our hope that you feel at home and among friends here. If you are a visitor for the day, we pray God's speed on your journey. If you are looking for a parish community, we would be delighted to welcome you into our parish family. Please introduce yourselves. TIPS FOR TAKING YOUNG CHILDREN TO MASS

Before Church... · Make sure children are well-fed right before Mass. They do not need to fast, nor will fasting help them to be on their best behavior during Mass. · Dress them in some special clothing that they wear only for church or other special events. It helps them to identify that what we do at Mass is different from everyday activity. · Check your diaper bag to make sure it is stocked for any possible needs. Consider including a small toy or book that your child sees only on Sunday at Mass.

For Toddlers or Older Children... · Read the readings in the car on the way to church. This could be the job of an older child. Then everyone hears them at least once in case someone has to step out during a portion of the Mass. · Before going into the church take a moment to remind children what you are about to do. Make sure they know what their job is at Mass. For us, we say that their job is to be quiet/still, to participate by sharing their voices and to pray.

**Why do we do that?
Catholic Life Explained...**

Someone close to me has left the Church. How should I reach out to them?

For many of us, this can be a challenging question. When people we love leave the Church, we may not always know how to relate to them in certain ways. Are some conversation topics off limits? Are there certain behaviors or decisions we can't support in good conscience? When someone or something is lost, Jesus shows two different attitudes in his parables.

One is actively seeking. Don't give up on this person and their life of faith. Ask them about their spiritual journey. Invite them to spend time with you in faith settings, as appropriate, and outside of them. Continue in relationship with those you love.

The other attitude Jesus shows is consistent witness in the waiting. In the parable of the Prodigal Son, the father doesn't go after the son. He waits for his return. However, the son knows his father is trustworthy. He remembers his father's fair treatment of the hired hands and knows it is safe to return, despite all he has done.

Your ability to change someone is quite small. However, you can change yourself. Make sure you consistently treat others with kindness, compassion, and respect. If your loved one wants a deeper conversation, they'll know you are a person to trust, a place to which they can return.

Fr. Ray's Book Review

Chapter 4 "Choosing Virtue" - You are suffering because you fear vice more than you love virtue. If you were able to stir your heart a little more deeply to the practice of meekness and true humility, you would be courageous.

Chapter 5 "A Pattern of Devotion" - Imagine yourself like our Lady, calmly working with one hand while holding on to our Lord with the other, or holding him with your other arm during his infancy.

Chapter 6 "Jesus In Our Heart" - How happy you will be if while you are in the world you keep Jesus in your heart. You will see that to the extent that this holy and considerate friend takes up a place in your mind, the world with its vanities and trifles will leave you.

Chapter 7 "Peace of Soul and Humility" - We want to pray as though we were bathing in comfort and to be virtuous as though we were eating dessert, all the while failing to look upon our sweet Jesus, prostrate on the ground, sweat blood and water from the distress of the extreme interior combat he underwent. Self-love is the source of our anxiety; the other is high regard for ourselves.

Chapter 8 "Christian Maturity" - Do not let yourself become angry at the imperfections that you habitually confess. Instead oppose those sins with courage and tranquility so that you will be able to make a solid resolution to correct them.
