"When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.'" - Lk 17:10b

*"When you have done all you have been commanded, say 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.'"*  
The metaphor in the story could seem harsh to us today. A servant has worked hard all day, and rather than receiving a much-needed respite, the master commands an additional task. Jesus, however, is appearing to their sensibilities. This was a hierarchical society in which everyone had a place. His listeners would know this. No servant would presume a reward for good deeds.

It's important to remember that we do have a place at God's table. But we don't "earn" it. Dining with the Lord at the heavenly wedding feast requires surrender. It requires deep faith in God and His promises. It also requires commitment. The kingdom takes work! There are fields to plow and initiatives to prepare. There are sheep to tend to and family to care for. There are people waiting for our yes to generous service. When we serve dinner at a homeless shelter, we are waiting on the table of Christ. When we visit an ill relative, we're imitating the Good Samaritan. We're visiting Jesus! We're growing his kingdom of life and love.

The Gospel today reminds us to check our motives. Are we serving because we're seeking a reward? Or because we have faith that this is who we're meant to serve? That is, is this where we're meant to be? The Gospel reminds us that this faith can do powerful things! *"If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you."* But, ultimately, we're not the ones doing the deeds. We're not the ones "earning" the grace. Faith, and the good we do for others, is a gift.

**Why do we do that?  
Catholic Life Explained...**

**What is the story behind the rosary?**

The rosary is a sacred and popular Catholic devotion, but its origins are mysterious. Prayer beads to facilitate meditation began in the early ages of the Church. In the early medieval period, bead strings were used to count Hail Marys or Our Fathers. A tradition has developed that the rosary in its current form was given to St. Dominic by the Blessed Mother. However, the earliest biographies of the saint do not include this story. In the Middle Ages, the prayers were grouped into 50 Hail Marys with verses from Psalms and vignettes from the lives of Jesus and Mary. By the 16th century, the Joyful, Sorrowful, and Glorious Mysteries were established.

The rosary rose to prominence in the late 1500s. The Turkish Empire was spreading across eastern Europe, and pirates were raiding Christian ships. The Christian nations of Europe rallied for a great battle at sea. Pope St. Pius V urged all Christians to pray the rosary for victory. While vastly outnumbered, the Christian fleet was victorious at the Battle of Lepanto. The pope established October 7th as the feast of the Holy Rosary. Later, all of October would come to be known as the Month of the Rosary.

Book Review**

**Chapter 23 "Imperfection"** - Keep your sight fixed upon God and yourself. You will never see God without seeing his goodness, or yourself without seeing your misery, and you will see that his goodness answers to your misery, and that your misery is the object of his goodness and mercy.

**Chapter 24 "Confidence Amid Tribulation"** - This confidence that restores our vigor will allow us to suffer and withstand with great courage any battle we face.

**Chapter 25 "A Strong Heart"** - When our heart makes itself ready to serve God, to honor him, to serve our neighbor, that is when the heart works miracles.

**Chapter 26 "John the Baptist"** - John remained solitary in the desert, without daring to come to see Jesus in person. Was there ever a mortification equal to this one.

**Chapter 27 "Ordered Desires"** - You are probably right in thinking that the true source of your woes is that you have a multitude of desires that cannot be satisfied. It is good to desire much, but you must order your desires and bring them forth according to its season and your ability.

**Chapter 28 "Impatience or Self-Love"** - You must banish anxiety; God wants you to serve him as you are. You must also love your state in life and its duties.

**OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH**

**T**op Reasons to Oppose Assisted Suicide: Some polls indicate that the public is receptive to assisted suicide. But the same polls show that people's views shift when they learn about its dangers - especially the dangers for those who are poor, elderly, disabled, or without access to good medical care. Consider that, in Oregon and California, some patients' health insurance offered to pay for assisted suicide, but not treatment. And in states where assisted suicide is legal, often no psychiatric evaluation or treatment is required. Additionally, assisted suicide fosters discrimination by creating two classes of people: those whose suicides we spend millions of dollars to prevent and those whose suicides we assist and treat as a positive good.
