“Because this widow keeps bothering me I shall deliver a just decision for her lest she finally come and strike me.” - Lk 18:5

“Render a just decision for me against my adversary.” Today’s Gospel features a persistent widow who ekes out justice from a notoriously cold-hearted judge. Why does she win the day? “Because the widow keeps bothering me.” Jesus’ recommendation to the disciples is to be persistent in prayer, because surely God the Father is far more attuned to their needs than this judge. If only it were that easy, right? We’ve all experienced the unanswered prayer, the silence after our cries. When this continues, sometimes it can be difficult to have faith in God or believe He answers prayers. It can be easy to lapse into a sense of His distance. We want Him to do something “fair,” which — in our limited view — typically means that something works out in our favor.

There are, of course, many legitimate cries for justice. We live in a fallen world filled with flawed human beings. We hurt each other, sometimes grievously, and our efforts to remake the world in our image can result in unjust, inhumane systems. Faced with the problem of evil, we may wonder how God will “secure the rights of his chosen ones.” Sometimes, He may well seem “slow to answer them.”

In the face of these very real questions, it’s important to recall the words of the prophet Isaiah, that God’s thoughts “are not [our] thoughts.” His ways are not our ways. God respects the freedom He has given us. When we see what free will has wrought, perhaps we question God’s better judgment! Yet somehow, we hear that He mysteriously works all things for our good. No matter what situation we find ourselves in, we are always free to love. We are invited to be persistent in our prayer, to continue bringing our concerns before God in trusting surrender. We are invited to love well in the circumstances we find ourselves in, to be a light in the darkness. No matter when — or if — our prayers are answered the way we would like, we are nonetheless invited to witness to “faith on earth.”

ST. JOHN PAUL II

When this popular pope died, crowds in St. Peter's Square chanted "santo subito" ("sainthood now"). The Vatican heard, and the sainthood cause for the jet-setting pontiff who helped bring down European communism was put on the fast track; he was beatified in 2011. A strong admirer of St. Faustina and her dedication to Divine Mercy, John Paul II was canonized on Divine Mercy Sunday 2014 by Pope Francis. A Pole and former actor shaped by World War II and the Cold War, Cardinal Karol Wojtyla of Krakow (John Paul II) was the first non-Italian pope in 455 years. In his 26-year pontificate, he evangelized on trips to 129 countries, upheld traditional church doctrine against dissent, connected with the world's youth, established World Youth Day, and named more than 450 new saints. He also modeled Christian values by forgiving his would-be assassin and living an increasingly frail old age in public.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained...

God rarely seems to answer my prayers. Is He really listening?

Throughout Scripture, God promises to answer the prayers of His people. Sometimes things don't turn out the way we'd hope. God won't miraculously do evil or fulfill selfish intentions. If we're praying for something immoral, God isn't going to answer that prayer for us! Of course, we still have the freedom to make choices, but it isn't God's movement. Sometimes we're not praying for something evil, but our intentions are less than honorable. For example, "Please convert my mother-in-law so she goes to church more and visits us less!" While God is no doubt at work in the woman's life, He likely won't answer that prayer in the way you'd expect!

After all, God knows what He is about. He has plans in mind for us, but they might not be what we think. For most of us, winning the lottery would bring about a material benefit. That said, funds used in continually purchasing tickets to provide the means for God to "work" could likely go towards better avenues of financial stability. God is concerned with our ultimate good. When we pray, we're invited to surrender our lives to Him. One of the first petitions in the Our Father is "Thy will be done." Sometimes the lack of an answer is an answer! Are we prepared to receive it?

Book Review**

Chapter 35 "A Time of Depression" - When we are sorrowful we must not be anxious. How happy you will be if you are faithful amid the crosses that present themselves to you, faithful to the One who loved you so faithfully unto death, even death on the cross.

Chapter 36 "Our Daily Bread" - We should be happy to be able to remain in the presence of God, and be content that he will make us bear fruit sooner or later, either daily or now and then, according to his good pleasure. We should not be anxious if we think we are doing nothing when we pray.

Chapter 37 "Oppressed by Pain" - Let us practice holy resignation and pure love of our Lord that is never as perfect as it is amid suffering. Accept your trials from his hand. Offer to suffer more. Accept small inconveniences in union with the pain he suffered on the cross. Tell God you not only accept the trials but you will love and cherish them.

Chapter 38 "The Envy of the Angels" - Angels envy us because we are able to suffer for our Lord, while they have never suffered anything for him. Suffering borne well will carry you closer to heaven.

Chapter 39 "A Quiet Life" - Souls who love Jesus and follow him into the desert, find a more delicious feast there upon the grass and the flowers than is ever enjoyed by those who choose the lavish pleasures of the world, where abundance suffocates joy.
