Book Review**

Chapter 6: The Malachi Test for Real Christians

Around the year 100 Mathetes wrote a philosophical explanation of the faith called the Epistle to Diognetus. The author stated that Christian worship is reasonable and logical. Christians could be found everywhere, but you might not notice them. They live in the pagan world and live like everyone else, they do not dress differently not separate themselves from non-Christians.

As time went by however, there developed dozens or possibly hundreds of Christian sects, all claiming to have the true teaching of Christ. The Catholic Church called them "heretics," meaning people who followed a faction, such as the Judaizing Christians, the Arians, Gnostics and the Marcianites. It so happened that the Malachi prophecy became the test for Christianity. In Malachi's vision, the same pure offering is made throughout the world, from the rising of the sun to its setting. Where is that actually true? Nowhere but in the Catholic Church.

Irenaeus, the Bishop of Lyons, defended the importance of the Old Testament which many of the Christian sect attacked. Irenaeus insisted of the Old Testament which many of the Christian sects attacked. Irenaeus insisted that the whole sacrificial cult of Israel was created by God for a good reason. God showed us pictures in them, of the heavenly things we could not see. The Temple sacrifices were preparing us for the perfect sacrifice to come with Jesus. All of the Old Testament sacrifices were necessary before we were free, and we have been slaves because we had shown, in incidents like the golden calf, that we could not be trusted. But this new oblation of the free, the Eucharist, offered in the new Temple of the body of Christ, is the one Malachi saw all those years ago when he gazed into the Messianic Age. The Temple cult was not a bad thing; it was created by God to lead us toward the perfect worship of the New Covenant. God had prescribed the sacrifice of the Temple, not because He needed them, rather because the people need those sacrifices to break away from the pagan neighbors and the Egyptian gods that they came to know while they were in Egypt.

When my children were younger, they could make me laugh and sometimes cry. I would have conversations about animals, nature, outer space, and so many amazing things in life. I would play with them one day and then work to bandage a boo-boo the next. There were so many dynamics to our relationship. However, one aspect was my favorite. It was when one of them would snuggle up next to me on the couch silently, often leading to sleep. There was no better feeling, and I didn't want to move for anything. It is crazy to think of all the things we would do together, and my favorite was when we essentially were doing nothing.

Do you think God desires a portion of you? Without a doubt, He wants all of you: the good, the bad, and the ugly. Walking with Him daily is so important, and we can never become the disciples and stewards we need to be without a deepening relationship. Yet, prayer is not just talking and listening. It is also being. We sometimes seek to communicate so much and do so many things that we forget the value of stewardship of presence. The giving of ourselves completely to another often requires us to simply be with that person. We feel their presence. We rest in their being. No words are needed because words would destroy the moment. This is what we are called to in a relationship with God. This is good stewardship because it is about giving of our very presence to God and receiving strength from that resting in Him. Sometimes, all we need is to snuggle up to our God on the couch.

SAINT FRANCES OF ROME

Dates: 1384–1440

Feast Day: March 9

This laywoman and foundress, born a Roman aristocrat, married Lorenzo Ponziano when she was 13; they had several children. In 1409, their palazzo was pillaged by Neapolitan soldiers and Lorenzo was exiled for five years, returning home a broken man. He died in 1436. Frances, known for her great charity during epidemics and civil war, organized a ladies society dedicated to self-denial and good works. It became the Oblates of Tor de Specchi, which she directed for her last four years. She is the patron saint of motorists, perhaps because she was guarded for 23 years by an archangel visible only to her. Her last words were: "The angel has finished his work. He is beckoning me to follow."
