"Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.'" Peter is a favorite apostle for many people. I wonder if it is because of his flawed, relatable humanity. Today's Gospel takes place after Jesus appears to the disciples and breathes the Holy Spirit upon them. And yet, Peter finds himself returning to his old way of life, to comfortable habits he formed long before following Jesus. Is something still lingering in him? Is something still lingering in us? Lent is over, and we should be rejoicing! But do you feel like you're still holding onto something? Or perhaps you had an excellent Lent. You encountered Jesus in a new way and grew in faith. But as the weeks since Easter have slipped by, some of your newfound devotion has begun to waver. The closeness you felt in your Lenten commitments has given way to humdrum status quo or turn-of-the-season busyness.

"Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter has endured so much in his walk of discipleship! But something is still weighing on him. In today's Gospel, Jesus confirms Peter's devotion three times, a redemption of his earlier threefold denial. The call of the Lord must come again, as if heard anew for the first time. So often, this is the pattern of the Christian life. We discover God and experience a new desire for our faith, but in time, our enthusiasm begins to wane. Perhaps something happens that startles us, or we startle ourselves by a poor decision. Then we discover God anew! Our joy returns...for a while. Even the Apostles were no strangers to the cyclical nature of spiritual growth. Our disappointments or frustrations should not be cause for giving up. Like Peter, we too can recommit and start anew. This Sunday and every day of our lives, Jesus is waiting to say again, "Follow me."

**Fr. Ray's Book Review**

Chapter 6 begins with the story of Simon's dinner party in which a woman came in and wiped Jesus' feet with her tears and her hair. Perhaps Simon prided himself on having spent a lot for this dinner, but he actually displayed limited refinement and little consideration for Jesus.

God is not indifferent to fine points of behavior. Our relationship with God involves numerous small details of love. A lack of concern for little things leads to great temptation and to lukewarmness, which hardens us and makes us insensible to the work of the Holy Spirit. One becomes careless about regular confession and being on time for Holy Mass. Our straying from God is not a sudden fall. Rather it is a result of separating ourselves from virtue little by little. The small things we do can draw the Lord's attention and move him to love us for doing them. There is not much difference between a genuflection done carefully and one done carelessly, but the difference matters to God. One is an act of adoration, a manifestation of faith, the other just a sloppy gesture. To enter a Church and make a short visit to the Lord in the tabernacle takes just a few minutes, but how much we gain in that time.

When faith grows weak and lukewarm, these details are considered of little importance. Laziness prevails over the honor due to God. We fail to show God the attention that belongs by right to someone who is loved.

**Why do we do that?  
Catholic Life Explained...**

**How do I bring God into the work of my daily life?**

Whatever your daily work, you have an opportunity to encounter God and to follow His commandments in love. In the New Testament, we see that most of the Apostles didn't have a previous religious position. They were fishermen, tax collectors, and political activists. St. Paul was a tentmaker. Among the saints, we have doctors, lawyers, farmers, and stay-at-home moms. No matter your daily tasks, God can be present there!

One way concerns behavior. Start with an examination of conscience. Look at areas where you tend to struggle to imitate Christ at work. Do you gossip? Does brimming frustration become impatience at home? Pick one sin you struggle with, then choose a virtue to strengthen that area. If you tend to speak poorly of your co-workers, resolve to stop and to say one kind thing a day instead.

Another way relates to perspective, particularly your perspective of others. Jesus' incarnation reminds us of the value of every human being. Jesus is God, and each of us is created in God's image. When you encounter another person, you have an opportunity to see God in a new place and a new way - in that person in front of you. Genuinely listen to them and be present to their concerns. Loving your neighbor is loving God! Our relationship with God and the love He inspires in our hearts shouldn't remain only at church on Sunday. We can - and should - let our faith animate our lives!
