"My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." - Jn 10:27-28b

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.

OLPA

We all face obstacles in life. Perhaps it's a lost job, the death of a loved one, a sudden accident that places an unexpected dent in our finances. Sometimes the challenges are of our own making. Perhaps we've developed patterns of sin in our personal lives or our family relationships. We've all felt the jolting shock of, "This is all my fault." How do these things affect our relationship with God? Or, perhaps more poignantly, how do we now view God's relationship to us?

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus' words to us are encouraging ones. "No one can take them out of my hand." Did you catch that? In case you didn't, Jesus reemphasizes the point again a few verses later. "My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one can take them out of the Father's hand." God's grip of providential care and mercy is so strong that nothing can separate us. We might think things take us out of God's hand - life circumstances, tragedy, our lukewarm attitudes towards faith - but Jesus tells us otherwise. Nothing, no one, can take us out of the Father's hand, and we can't take ourselves out! We can't remove ourselves from Him, not entirely. Even when grievous sin hardens us to grace, His love is still sustaining us in existence. And His mercy is always awaiting our repentance.

"My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." This Sunday, let us heed the voice of the Good Shepherd. Whatever we feel might take us from God's hand, we can turn back to Him. God is always inviting us to follow Him and to trust in His care and be sustained by His hand.

Fr. Ray's Book Review

Fr. Ray is providing his chapter by chapter thoughts on the book "Overcoming Lukewarmness" by Francis Fernandez-Carvajal. If you are interested in acquiring this book go to Scepter Press or Amazon.

Chapter 7 begins with a quote by St. Teresa of Avila: "The lukewarm do not embrace the cross but just drag it." The reason is that they seek the wide road, easy, pleasant, something that requires the least amount of effort. A lukewarm person is deeply selfish and self-serving. Jesus on the other hand invites us to take up our cross and to follow him to deny ourselves. We are invited to live for God, not for ourselves.

A philosopher once said that what often stands between man and God, blocking out God, is man himself. Forgetting about ourselves and being concerned for others brings with it liberation, joy, peace, and the ability to contemplate Christ. People who are unaccustomed to denying themselves will find both self-possession and the attainment of God exceedingly difficult. We must be watchful not to be carried away by an uncontrolled desire for well-being. Small pleasures and reasonable comforts are entirely compatible with the ideal of Christian temperance.

Temperance makes a person more human. Chastity, sobriety, humility, and meekness, which are forms of temperance, are only possible by the exercise of those small denials closely related to inner joy, cheerfulness full of meaning. The Lord has not promised us a comfortable life but full life in following Him. We make progress as disciples of the Lord by regular mortifications.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained...

At a parish council meeting, our pastor mentioned the need for deacons. It is something I am considering. How do I know if I have a vocation? What steps should I take next?

Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the Body of Christ, what one member does affects all. What the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then acknowledged by the official call to orders or to service.

If you are considering becoming a deacon, the first step would be to talk to your pastor. He will be able to give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how you apply. You might also begin to see a spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer, your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply. Best wishes!
