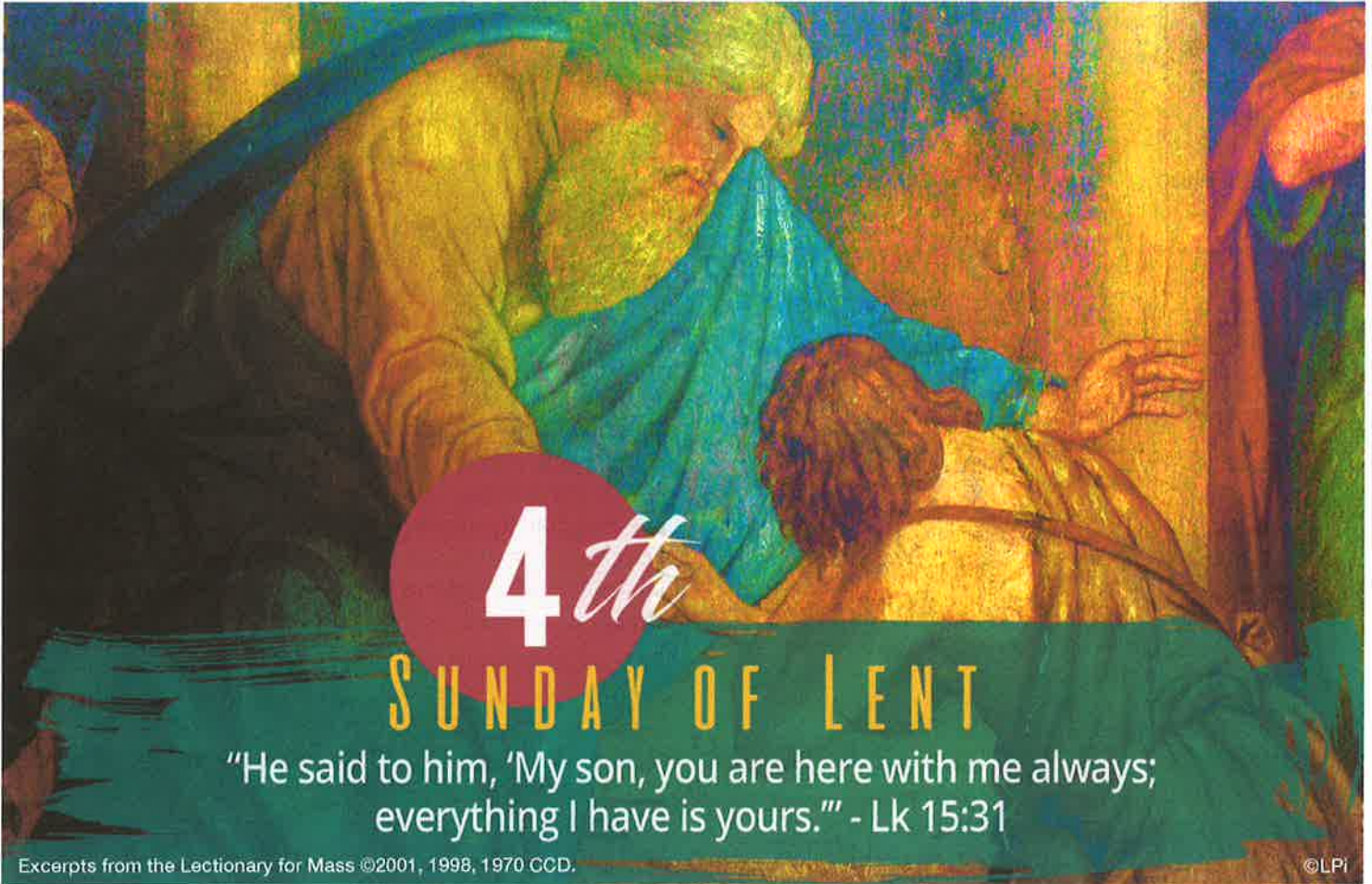

SUNDAY OF LENT

"He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours.'" - Lk 15:31

Repentance. Envy. Joy. Hope. Have you felt these human emotions? Today's Gospel offers a rich story, one we can all find our place in. As we reflect on our own spiritual lives this Lenten season, it can be helpful to imagine ourselves in the story of the Prodigal Son. "I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers." The younger son has sinned greatly, betraying his father's trust and squandering his money in sin. Yet the parable turns on his deep repentance and humble return to his father. Is there any area of your life you have been wandering from God or you've squandered good gifts? This Lent, return to the sacrament of Confession! God, a merciful Father, waits for you there.

"While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him." The father in the parable sees his son's selfishness, perhaps even suspects what he might do, but gives him the inheritance anyway. After his son's departure, the father waits with hope for his son's eventual return. Has someone you love left the Church, made poor decisions, or abused your trust? This Lent is a time to let go of bitterness and to live in hope. Prepare your heart to be merciful!

Not all in the parable invite the mercy of God into their hearts. The self-righteous older brother dishonors his father with his pettiness. "My son, you are here with me always, everything I have is yours." Do you covet what others have? Do you feel as if you've been taken advantage of or that your work goes unseen? This Lent is a time to grow in gratitude. Take a close look at the blessings in our life that you might be missing.

We are all called to repentance. Open your heart to God's personal invitation to growth!

Fr. Ray is providing his chapter by chapter thoughts on the book "Overcoming Lukewarmness" by Francis Fernandez-Carvajal. If you are interested in acquiring this book go to Scepter Press or Amazon.

Fr. Ray's Book Review

Chapter 1 starts off the book by reminding us that we were created by God for happiness. Anguish and sorrow are opposed to the very essence of God. If you are tired, tell the Lord; if you find serious difficulties, leave them in the hands of the Lord. You must avoid giving someone the impression by your personal attitude that the Master's yoke is not gentle, is not a yoke of love.

If we are careless, the happiness our heart really desires gets put off and eludes us as the years go by. We think we can find happiness in things like money, success, notoriety. A man once wrote in 961: "I have had everything that a man may wish in this world. I have lived 75 years. I have been a king for 50 years. I have been happy for nine days."

St. Augustine wrote: "You made us for yourself, and our hearts find no peace until they rest in you." True happiness leads us to purify our hearts of bad instincts and to seek the love of God above all else. God alone is the source of every good and of all love. Joy and true peace can only be found in God, never apart from him. The Christian is joyful because the essence of his life is to love, especially to love God. Seeking happiness apart from God leads to solitude and sadness.

We need to keep Christ in front of us, perfectly clear in our eyes of faith. Trouble begins for a Christian when he does not see clearly as a result of lukewarmness or sin. Then Jesus becomes distant, blurred, and his face is no longer recognizable. Joy is vulnerable.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained...

What is holy water and how do I explain the reason that it is placed at the entrances of churches to my non-Catholic friends?

Holy water is a sacramental, a reminder of the life of the Church expressed and celebrated through the sacraments. God's grace is mediated through word and gesture (the outward signs). This comes to us through Jesus (instituted by Christ) as he entrusts to the Church his saving mission (to give grace). In turn the Church, through the sacraments, shares that grace and mission with us.

On Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes on our foreheads to remind us of our origins, humbly created from the dust. But by blessing ourselves with holy water, we are reminded of our destiny! We are baptized sons and daughters of God. This is also a call to conversion, to live more fully our baptismal call to live as disciples of Jesus. We see holy water whenever we renew our baptismal promises. This will occur during the Easter liturgy as well, reminding us that we are indeed on a journey of faith and renewed in Christ. Blessing ourselves with holy water reminds us that we are baptized into a community faith, and always in need of turning from sin and toward God. Holy water is a visible sign of our baptism!

THE WAY OF THE CROSS DEVOTION

In 1750, after returning from a Holy Land Pilgrimage, St. Leonard of Port Maurice (Memorial Date: November 27) created the devotion, The Way of the Cross and personally erected the first set of Stations in Rome's Colosseum. St. Leonard is called the "Saint of the Stations of the Cross" because he erected 571 sites to venerate the Stations of Jesus Christ's Passion and Death throughout Italy and elsewhere.

St. John Paul II, in 2000, led the Way of the Cross at the Colosseum. He said, in part: "We are here because we are convinced that the Way of the Cross of the Son of God was not simply a journey to the place of execution. It is a means to experience, in the Holy Spirit, the love hidden within the Cross of Jesus Christ. It is a means to take up our own cross, strengthened by this love, in imitation of the One who endured the Cross for our salvation."

Answers from March 24:

1) True, he used this term for the first time in his Letter to the Smyrnaeans; **2) False**, the Church is called Catholic because she is meant for everyone, everywhere; **3) False**, the Church began on Pentecost Sunday; **4) True**, the Church is a perfect society not in her members, since we are all sinners, but by her nature and her rights since she possess in herself and by herself, by the will and the goodness of her Founder, everything that is necessary for her existence and her efficacy; **5) False**, this is the notion of impeccability which is the inability to sin. Only Jesus was impeccable; **6) The Pope's infallibility is guaranteed only when he speaks officially on matters of faith and morals;** **7) True**, the Pope's teaching must be given due assent by all of us; **8) True**, as defined formally at Vatican I in 1870; **9) True;** **10) False**, the last Church Council was Vatican II.
