What does it mean to be salt and light? If we listen carefully to Jesus' words, we gain some direction. To be salt means to bring taste, zest, and joy to life. We are asked to liven things up a bit by allowing the joy of our faith to spill over into the lives of others. Only a sincere and deep relationship with God can freshen up humanity and set it on proper course. To be light means that our faith must translate into action so that we can be Christ for others and extend the same arm of mercy and compassion that Christ did. Our acts of piety, then, cannot be directed solely at ourselves. Prayer is never about self-benefit but must always be directed toward union with God, deepening our relationships with one another and learning how to be effective stewards of the beautiful universe God has entrusted to our care.

The Master gives us wise direction in terms of how we can best become the salt and light he desires. Listen carefully to the Beatitudes. Think about the oppression and alienation that exists in our world, the violence and prejudice, the anger and the hatred, the fear and the shame. All of these things require action. The poor need food, housing, and clothes. Hatred must be replaced by love. Retaliation and violence by forgiveness. Our thoughts and speech can become more like Christ. We can change and continue to change. Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman said, "To live is to change and to be perfect is to have changed often."

But it doesn't end with just offering the bandages needed to heal wounds. It must go deeper. We must ask ourselves what has happened that we have found ourselves in this place with these wounds and divisions. What are their causes? Together we must address these systemic problems, politically and spiritually, and face the truth. Only then will we truly be salt and light. But then again, we may not like what the light shows us.

Fr. Ray's Book Review

Chapter 2: My Messenger

In the second chapter we see that in Hebrew Malachi means "my messenger." Malachi's main concern was the sacrifice in the Temple. He believed the priests were not taking the sacrifice seriously anymore and showing open contempt by offering the worst instead of the best to God. He said God wanted the Temple to be shut completely so that those sacrifices wouldn't be offered at all. Then in his prophetic vision, Malachi saw the perfect sacrifice, a pure sacrifice offered all over the world, in every place and time.

All the sacrifices made in the Old Testament have something in common: the idea that we give God what is most valuable to us. Of all things, life is the most valuable, which is why so many sacrifices in the Bible are bloody sacrifices. When the people of God settled in their homeland, God chose Jerusalem as the proper place for sacrifices since He chose to reside there with the people. The Temple was the only place Sacrifices to the God of Israel could be made.

The priesthood was hereditary and God would provide for them. However Malachi said that the priests took money from the people's sin offerings which motivated the priests to encourage the people to sin. To Malachi, the sin of the priests is the sin of Cain. They were not giving God acceptable sacrifices.

When Malachi wrote about a pure sacrifice to God he was describing a vision of the future. To convert pagans and Gentiles to the one true God would be difficult. The early Christians though saw themselves as heirs of that same prophetic tradition. When the Christians condemned the Jewish establishment, they spoke words from Jeremiah, Hosea, Micah, Zephaniah, and Malachi. When the Christians looked at Malachi's prophecy of the world wide pure offering, they saw the Eucharist. St. Paul later on will say there is still a Temple, a place for God's name to dwell, but now that place is wherever there is a faithful Christian.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained...

Why is it so important that we register in a parish?
Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.

Reminders for Communicating with legislators:

* When emailing your legislators, remember to indicate in the subject line that you live in their district, the particular House Bill or Senate File that you are contacting them about, and whether or not you want the bill to pass or fail. For example,

Subject: *"I live in House District 1 Please Vote YES on HB#0"*

This tells them that you are a constituent, which means more than an email coming from someone they do not represent. This also makes it easy for them to tally "yes" or "no" votes on that particular bill from their inbox. The same information is pertinent if you choose to call your legislator, instead. Also, there is nothing wrong with emailing all of the legislators; just know that it will make a bigger impact on those who represent your district.

* Be polite. We will not always like the way our legislators vote on a particular bill, but he/she might be the final vote needed on the next important bill.

* Be concise. By the end of the session, our legislators will have read hundreds of bills and emails. If it isn't concise, it will likely not be read.

* Avoid using "strawman" arguments. Instead, debate like Thomas Aquinas. Use the strongest arguments presented by the other side before illustrating why those arguments do not ultimately hold up.

* Avoid oversimplifying the issue. It may seem clear to you, but it won't be to everyone.

* If your legislator indicates they will be voting in a way that opposes Catholic Social Teaching, remember that the battle for justice belongs to God. We are just privileged to engage in it for a time. Thank them for listening and let them know you plan to stay in touch.

* Follow through. Schedule a time with your legislators after the session to get to know them and to allow them to get to know you. Remember, we can't positively influence anyone if we have written them off, so keep trying. We must be like the persistent widow.

* If your points aren't received, try to find new and creative ways of explaining.

* Remember, we are all sinners and sin darkens the intellect. It clouds our vision and our ability to see the dignity of human persons in certain contexts. So we rely on each other's help to see

the image and likeness of God reflected in the human person at every age, stage and situation. Until we have a clear picture of human dignity in our minds, it is impossible to clearly contemplate our responsibilities toward one another in every circumstance.

* Working to highlight the dignity of human persons begins with you and the people in front of you.

* Know that your effort makes a difference! A few persuasive contacts from constituents can be enough to move a bill up or down. Also, because sessions are so short, they often don't have time to fully consider all of the implications that will occur if they pass or fail a bill. That means they really do need to hear from you!

* Finally, don't forget to lift all of our legislators and lobbyists up in prayer.

Scholastica and her brother, St. Benedict, were born to a wealthy Christian family in Nursia, Italy. Details of their lives come from the Dialogues of St. Gregory the Great. After Benedict established his monastery at Monte Cassino, she founded a convent at Plombariola, and was its abbess for many years. The siblings met once a year outside Monte Cassino. At their final meeting, Scholastica begged Benedict to stay the night and, when he wouldn't, she asked God for help. A violent storm ensued and Benedict had to stay. They spent the night discussing the joys of heaven, and she died three days later. Scholastica is the patron saint of Benedictine nuns and convulsive children.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP**What's the Buzz?**

When a new store or restaurant opens in the area, there can be quite a buzz. People want to see what the place is like. If the establishment is lucky, a positive word of mouth can spread all over the area. The challenge then becomes keeping that buzz alive. If people start to think that the new place is not as good as advertised or they had hoped, the crowds will dwindle and soon the new place will simply become an old place. Even worse, it could become a closed place.

If you were a store owner, what would you do to attract people? Would you always put your best foot forward? How hard would you work to show everybody that your place is worth repeated visits and patronage?

You may not be an entrepreneur with your own business, but you do have your parish community. This is your community and what you do and how you act in the world around you will either add to a buzz or a lack of interest.
