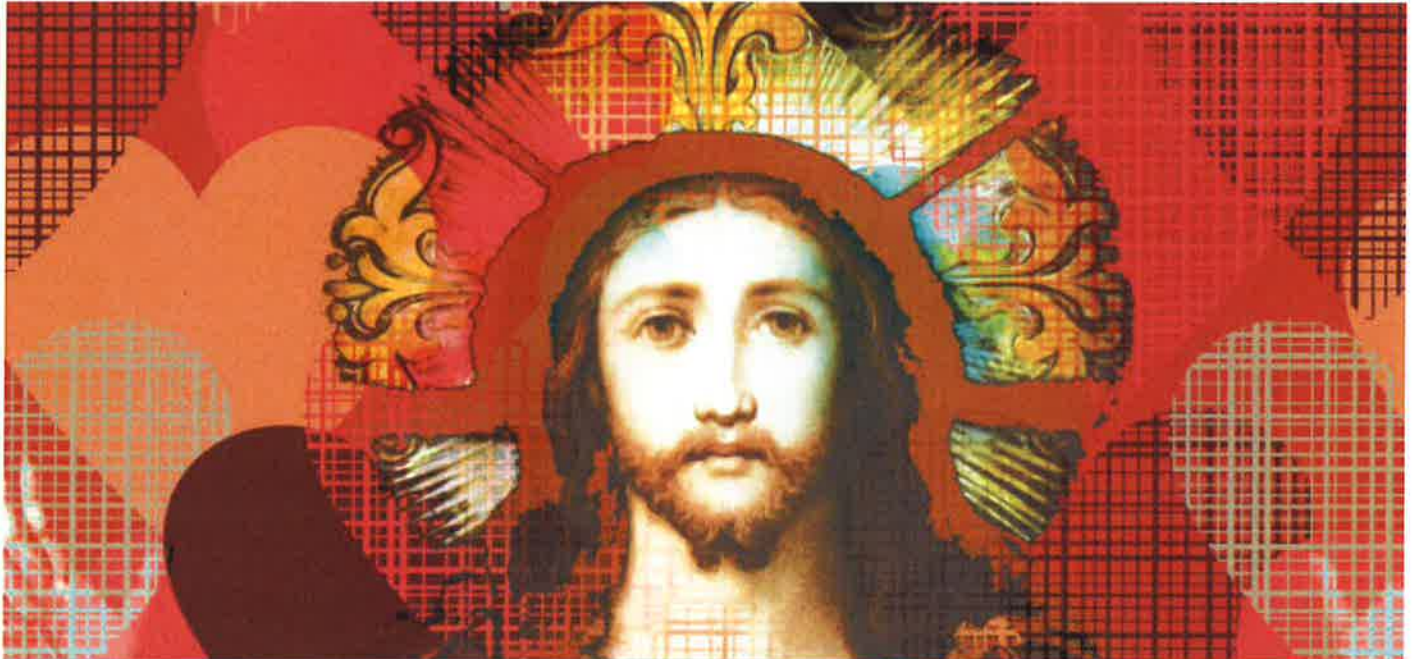

*"I give you a new commandment:
love one another." - Jn 13:34a*

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.

Fifth Sunday of Easter "I give you a new commandment: love one another." With these words, Jesus sums up the law and the prophets in one concise phrase. Love one another. After 2,000 years, you'd think we'd have it figured out by now! But all too often we fail in this commandment. Perhaps we mistake "love" for mere "common decency." Perhaps we've been betrayed, or our own visions of love have been tarnished or misrepresented in our lives. Blessedly, Jesus doesn't leave us without a guide.

"As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." Jesus himself modeled what this love should look like. So what are some of the characteristics of the love of Christ? Humility, for one. St. Paul writes that Jesus "emptied Himself." In becoming man, Jesus puts aside the full splendor of the Godhead. Not only does he become human, but he takes on many of the mundane privations of human life. He spent most of his life in relative poverty - especially by our standards - as a common laborer. When he began gaining popularity as a preacher, he still traveled on foot and spent nights in other people's homes or outdoors.

Jesus' love is generous. He was always available to the crowds and to being interrupted by people in need. He invested time in his disciples and patiently taught them about the kingdom of God. The love of Jesus is also courageous. He encountered many people deemed less worthy of human respect, due to being public sinners or having a physical or mental disability. Jesus was brave in breaking these social boundaries to show care and concern to the outcast. These traits are possible for us to imitate! Indeed, we are hardly identifiable as Christians without them. "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Fr. Ray's Book Review

In chapter 8 we are reminded that we don't fall abruptly into lukewarmness. Rather we lose the supernatural sense of life little by little as we begin to reason, judge and act in an exclusively human, worldly way. Lukewarmness fills the soul with a kind of darkness. God is seen as just one more thing, with no real bearing on everyday activities.

Rarely does a lukewarm soul ask God for help. Sel-dom does he thank God for anything. The lukewarm person has the makings of an atheist.

The interior life of relationship with God gives one a profound vision of existence, the supernatural vision. If our interior dispositions are good, we see God in everything: in nature, in sorrow, in what looks like life failure and in work. When we see with the eyes of faith, we become aware of God's presence and discern what is genuinely valuable in life. Christians who have a living faith act in a manner befitting this supernatural sense that pervades their lives.

When Jesus healed ten lepers he expected ten to return and give thanks to God. Only one returned. Perhaps the other nine had come to think that being cured was something natural, something they had a right to. To be thankful is human; to be thankful is also divine. A lukewarm person forgets that God is watching over us and that we have a role to play, one that we must perform well. We must do all things in the presence of God.

**Why do we do that?
Catholic Life Explained...**

I've heard of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. What are they, and what's the difference?

As God has shown us mercy, so too are we called to show mercy to those we encounter. We see mercy throughout the Gospels, but the parable in Matthew 25 forms the foundation for the first set of Works of Mercy. This parable of the last judgment shows each person being asked how well they cared for those around them, and being reminded that this care for those in need is care for God Himself. Each person is asked if they have fed the hungry, given drink to the thirsty, clothed the naked, sheltered the stranger, cared for the sick, and visited the imprisoned. These - along with burying the dead - are the Corporal Works of Mercy, as they primarily concern the physical life of a person.

The list of the Spiritual Works of Mercy developed later. These actions of love primarily concern the inner life of a person. They are instructing the ignorant, counseling the doubtful, admonishing sinners, bearing wrongs patiently, forgiving offenses, comforting the afflicted, and praying for both the living and the dead. All of these actions are concrete ways of bringing the love of God into the world.
