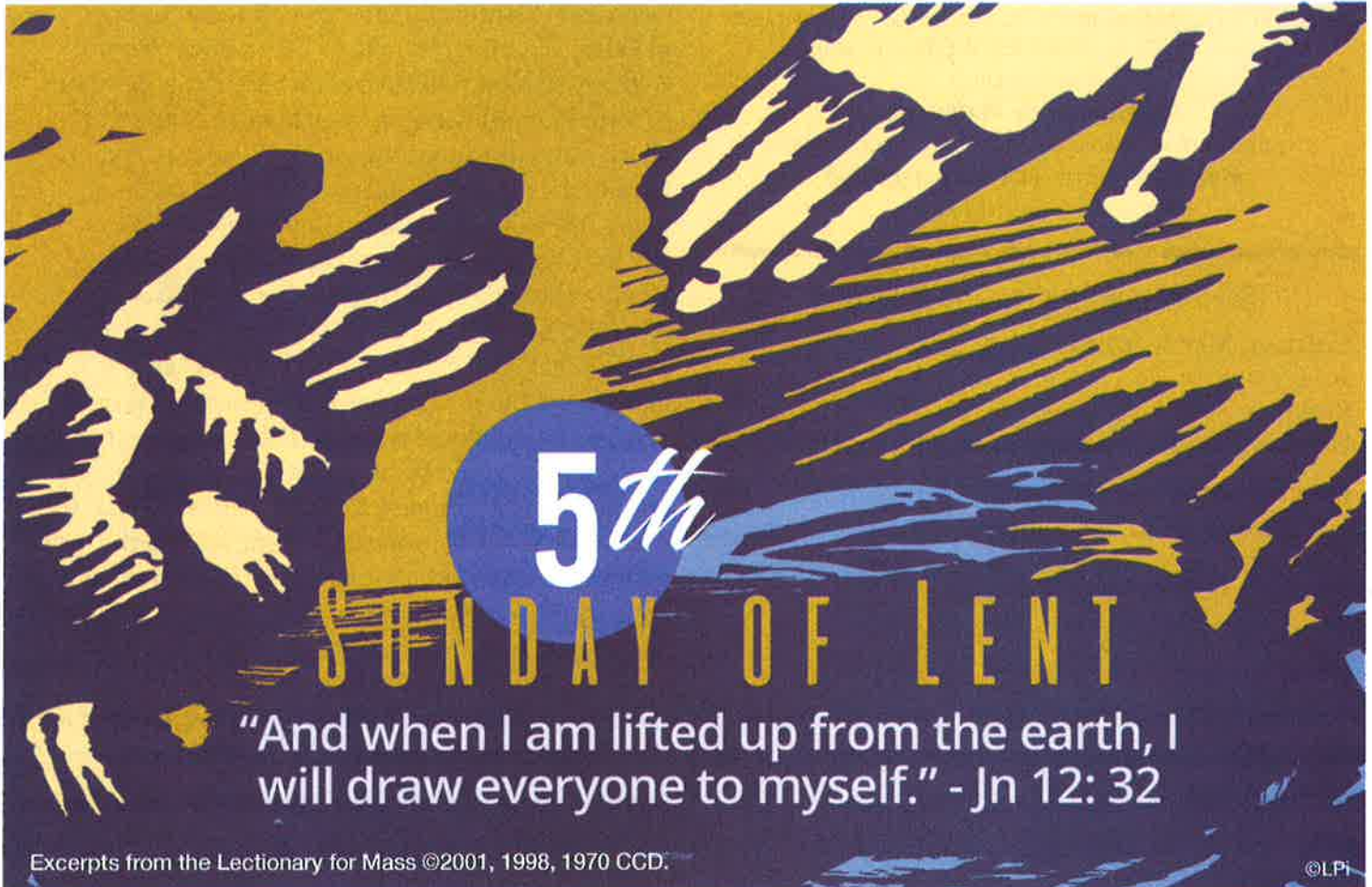

"Now there were some Greeks among those who had come to worship at the feast. They came to Philip and asked him, 'Sir, we would like to see Jesus.'" It has begun. News of Jesus has spread beyond native-born, Aramaic-speaking Jews. We don't know if the Greeks mentioned here heard of Jesus from fellow travelers or if news of this intriguing rabbi had reached all the way to their home. What we do know is that this interaction spurred an interesting comment from Jesus: "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." In other words, it has begun. The time has come for the message to move beyond the geographic bounds of Israel.

But what does this message require? The Gospel is clear: "he said this indicating the kind of death he would die." A grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies to its life as only a seed. A caterpillar takes on the appearance of temporary death in order to transform into a butterfly. In the Gospels, sacrifice and death are a way of becoming something more than you were before. This Lent, new life can come from our sacrifices. When we enter into the season with Jesus, our difficulties can transform our perspective. "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit."

As we abstain from meat and fast from eating between meals, we can grow in compassion for the hungry. We can give alms of our time, sacrificially spending time with the lonely, the sick, and the marginalized. Our little Lenten "deaths" -- death to unnecessary preferences, death to selfish living, death to ignorance of other's pain -- can bring new life to the world long after the season is over. This is the invitation this Sunday and every Lenten season, to begin anew from death to life.

Answers from March 11:

1) True, the empty tomb has become the image that helps us to think of Easter as we see in #640 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church; **2) True**, as #640 of the CCC tells us, there are a number of other possible explanations for an empty tomb; **3) False**, in Matthew 27:60, we are told that the tomb was made for Joseph to use when he died, Joseph simply gave the tomb to the family of Jesus to use; **4) False**, as we see in Mark 16:4, they had sealed the tomb by using a very large stone to close off the entrance; **5) False**, according to John 11 Lazarus was from Bethany so he would have been buried there instead of Jerusalem; **6) False**, as seen in #641 of the CCC which reminds us that the empty tomb was first discovered by Mary Magdalene and the holy women who came to finish anointing the body of Jesus; **7) False**, coming into contact with a dead body would make one unclean, so a tomb in those days were dug out of the rock, and the body was placed in until all that remained were the bones, then the bones were put into a small box known as the ossuary. The bones would be left in the tomb, but then another body could be placed in the tomb until that one becomes just bones; **8) True**, John arrived at the tomb first as seen in John 20:3-6 and he saw the burial cloth and the cloth that had covered the face of Jesus; **9) True**, John saw the same thing Peter did, but only John believed in the Resurrection at that time; **10) True**, as seen in #642 of the CCC, many more saw and believed, but as Jesus said, blessed is the one who did not see but still believed.

Dear Padre

I feel self-conscious striking my breast at Mass. Isn't this gesture rather exaggerated?

The Roman Missal proscribes that the assembly strike their breasts at "through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault" during the Confiteor. It doesn't specify striking three times. Later in Eucharistic Prayer I, the priest strikes his breast with his right

hand, saying, "To us, also, your servants, who, though sinners...."

Clasping our hands in front of our breast is a recognized gesture of prayer; striking the heart or breast is an ancient penitential expression. It calls to mind Jesus' parable of two men who prayed in the Temple, a prideful Pharisee and a humble tax collector who "beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner'" (Luke 18:13).

"Gestures, language, and actions are the physical, visible, and public expressions by which human beings understand and manifest their inner life" (Built of Living Stones, NCCB/USCC, 2000). The liturgy has a rich tradition of movements that can foster or distract from prayer. "When the gestures are done in common, they contribute to the unity of the worshiping assembly. Gestures which are broad and full in both a visual and tactile sense support the entire symbolic ritual" (Environment and Art in Catholic Worship, 56).

Thus, at Mass we bow our heads, bend our knees, and beat our breasts out of humility and reverence for God, "for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted" (Luke 18:14).
