Even though we say that we believe, there is a part of us that doesn't. There are many times in our lives when we experience death, whether it be the physical death of someone we love, a failed relationship, the loss of a job, or a broken dream. As we are going through these death experiences, we can easily find ourselves reaching out to God to make it better and fix it! We think that the proper order of life is to maintain the things of this world, especially those things that are essential to our sense of well-being and security. We do not like change. The grieving that comes from our death experiences can keep us stuck and in despair. If we have lost something or someone of great value, the very meaning and essence of life is lost with them. We need gentle companions to lift us from despair and that is precisely who God desires to be in our life as well.

God calls us out of our tombs, where we have been closed up in fear and despair, and shouts, "Come out!" He desperately wants to show us the path to hope and the new life that is possible after loss and death. But our faith can be weak, and we still prefer to cling to the memory of what we had rather than the joyful possibilities of tomorrow. We sometimes live as if God is not real and that the transformative power of His resurrected presence is a story found in the Bible rather than a narrative unfolding in our lives.

God is the God of surprises, not our demise. God opens new possibilities, begins new chapters, creates new verses, and brings us to new heights! We spend so much time and energy ruminating over what we left behind yesterday that we are far too tired to see what can unfold tomorrow. Loving someone new doesn't negate our past loves. Embracing the love of a person, God, or life itself tomorrow doesn't diminish the love of yesterday. Each of our loves is different, and one cannot be replaced by another. They don't cancel each other out. God truly has tended to every detail of our lives, and if we listen to each detail, we find that they all lead us back to Him. Jesus wants us to come out of our closed-up tombs. Are we going to listen this time?

DIOCESAN UPDATE ON COVID-19

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Cheyenne has temporarily suspended all Masses, including daily Masses, effective March 17. This decision was made after participating in a conference call with Governor Gordon, the Wyoming Department of Health, and other leaders of faith-based organizations in Wyoming. Parish offices will remain open for now.

"While the celebration of the Eucharist is the source and summit of parish life, the need to protect public health is paramount at this time," Bishop Steven Biegler said. "We continue to pray for all of those who are ill, especially those affected by COVID-19, and for healthcare workers and first responders."

The Diocese of Cheyenne will continue to monitor the situation and will share updates as they are available.

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion, which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion is an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and lovingly embrace him at a time or in circumstances when one cannot receive Him in sacramental Communion. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

The 6 Characteristics of an Everyday Stewardship for Lent – Committed

I remember Jim Valvano, Jimmy V to many, saying the iconic words, “Don’t give up; you can never give up.” The former coach of the NC State men’s basketball team was dying of cancer, yet he refused to throw in the towel and give in to his disease. His words exemplified the best of the human spirit we all share. Sometimes, living out those words seem much more difficult than saying them.

**Why do we do that?
Catholic Life Explained...**

What is the difference between a basilica and a cathedral?

Basilicas are churches that are so titled because of their antiquity, dignity, historical importance, or significance as centers of worship. A cathedral is the principal church of a diocese, which contains the chair of the bishop, or “cathedra” in Latin. The chair is the symbol of the bishop’s teaching authority.

**Fr. Ray's
Book Review**

Chapter 9: A Couple of Cyrils

St. Cyril of Jerusalem pointed to Malachi as predicting the Eucharistic celebrations of the universal Church and the downfall of Judaism. St. Cyril wrote: "The Savior built out of the Gentiles a second Holy Church, the Church of us Christians, concerning which he said to Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church."

In the 3rd Century the Apostolic Constitutions were written as an updated version of the instructions from the Didache. It viewed the Eucharist as the perfect sacrifice in Malachi.

Cyril of Alexandria reminded the Christians that Jesus did say that he had not come to abolish the law and the prophets, but to fulfill them. However, Jesus later said that the hour was coming when the true worshipers would worship the Father in spirit and truth. Thus when we celebrate the Christian sacrifice we are celebrating the reality represented by the Law of Moses. All of Cyril's arguments depended on a particularly Christian reading of the Old Testament. To be a Christian was to believe that the Old Testament was making the paths straight for the ultimate coming of Christ. Cyril knew the Old Testament and used his knowledge to support his arguments, in fact, all of the Church Fathers of the time were convinced that knowing the Old Testament was tremendously important for any Christian who knew the faith, and no one knew the Old Testament better than St. Jerome.

Jerome believed that every Christian bishop needed to know that Malachi foretold the Church, and also the rejection of Judaism. Those were the two prongs of Malachi's prophecy; salvation has come to the world through the Jews, but Jewish rites have been rejected now that the pure offering is established from the rising of the sun to its setting.
