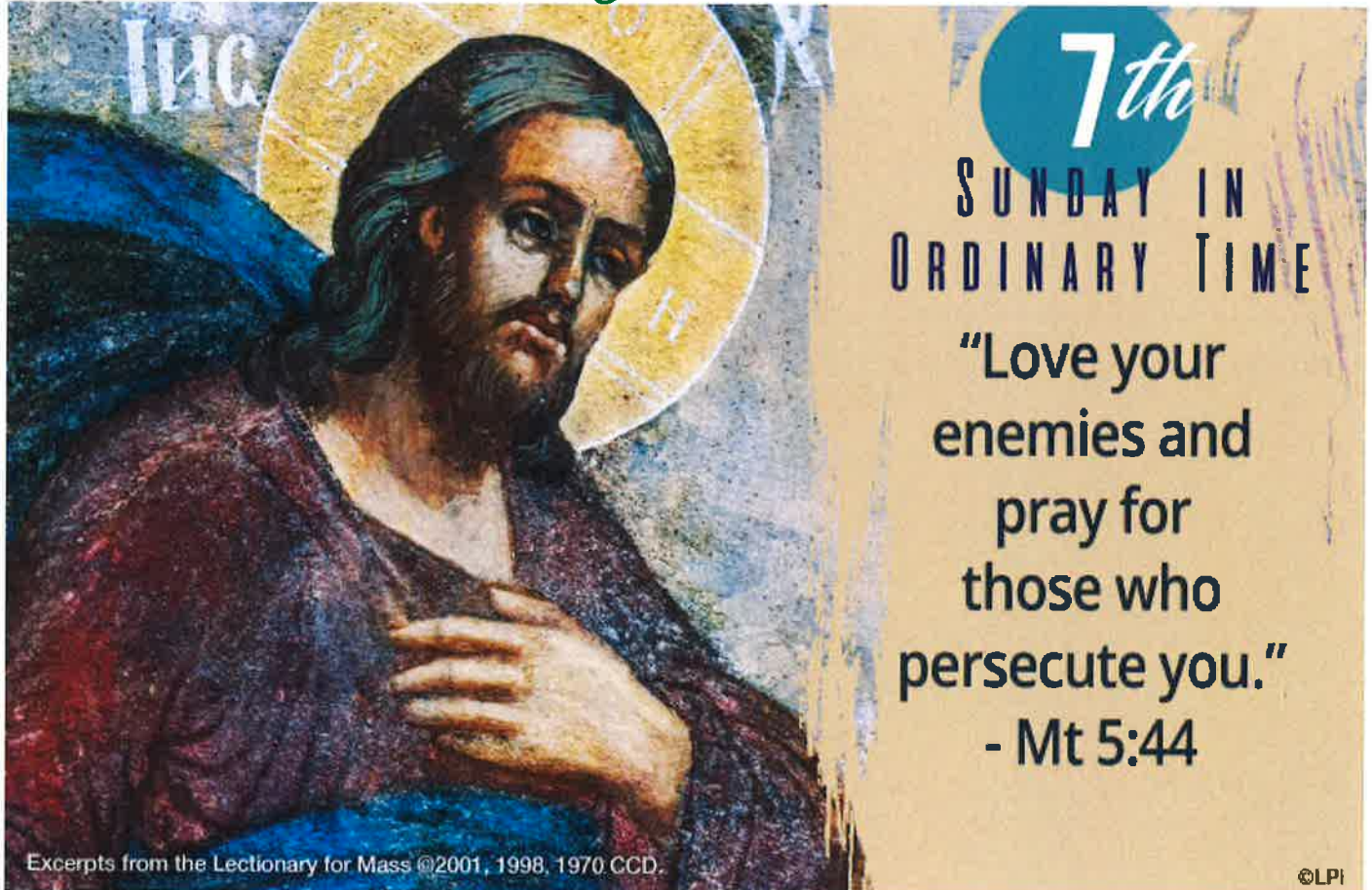

The Gospels continue to challenge us to the core. This is especially true in the way our social relationships have developed. Feeling safe and secure in the world are not things that come easily these days. Actually, we may find ourselves feeling more reservation, caution, reluctance, and fear than ever before. In a moment's notice, life can drastically change. When someone has been intentionally and violently hurt, especially someone we love, we can all too easily find ourselves very attracted to the Old Testament philosophy of "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth."

Intellectually, we know this is not what Jesus wants us to do. But on some level it just seems to make practical or even political sense. After all, why should we allow someone to get away with a heinously violent act? Yet, Jesus cannot be any clearer than he is with this! Offer no resistance to one who is evil. Turn the other cheek as well. When pressed into service, go two miles. Do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow. Love your enemies. Now, take a moment to reflect on all of this. Consider a horrible act of violence committed against someone you love. Listen. Think. Be honest. Can you do as Jesus directs?

We want to be holy. But we are more comfortable with a definition of holiness that can keep us saying our prayers and on our knees in church. We are not comfortable with a definition of holiness that has something to say about to how we react to and negotiate life. We like to keep a sharp and strong line between the secular and the sacred. In fact, we would prefer that the doors between them be kept closed. God wants us to be holy as He is holy. If God sees this one way and we see it another, then where does this leave us on our journey to God?

Our minds like the practical, worldly, and secular answers to things. They are more black and white and at first glance appear to make more sense. Holiness wells up from our souls and is beyond reason. It cannot be explained. It is something we just simply know comes as a result of deep prayer. The truly contemplative eye knows inwardly that what Jesus asks is true and then willingly does it. It may not be easy.

Fr. Ray's Book Review

Chapter 4: Ignatius of Antioch becomes the Eucharist
A little after the year 100, Ignatius, the Bishop of Antioch, was arrested and sent to Rome for his execution as a Christian. On the way to Rome, Ignatius will write seven letters which tell of his story on the way to Rome to die. He wanted to die in Rome to become part of the pure offering Malachi had foreseen. Ignatius was escorted to Rome by Ten Roman guards. He believed it was better to die a martyr rather than to be King of all the earth.

Antioch was where the name "Christian" was first used. Antioch was also one of the three important cities in the Roman Empire, next to Rome and Alexandria. Peter had been head of the Church in Antioch before he went to Rome. The Bishop of Antioch was one of the most important Christian leaders. Ignatius gave the Christians who came out to meet him on the road to Rome encouragement during those difficult times. Since Jesus died for him, he wanted to die for Jesus. Our suffering is worthy because the sufferings of Jesus was real. All of our sufferings are bound up with his in the sacrifice of the Eucharist. Ignatius wanted to be consumed by beasts in the arena so that he would become the Eucharist for others. Ignatius believed that Malachi's vision was being fulfilled with the increase of Christians, from the rising of the sun to its setting.

Ignatius was also aware of the divisions in the Church, but since the Eucharist was one, the Churches had to struggle to be united. The infallible mark of a heretic was not participating in the Eucharistic sacrifice. When salvation came into the world it came in the form of that one pure sacrifice. That is why unity is the sign of the real Catholic Church, and preserving unity is worth a lot of trouble. Ignatius is the first to use the term "Catholic Church," "Catholic" means universal. The sign of that unity is the Eucharist, the one sacrifice all over the world, from the rising of the sun to its setting. For Ignatius the Christian Church is the only place where the real sacrifice is offered to the God of Abraham, Moses and David.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on **February 26**. During Lent all Christians are required to do penance. It is also recommended for your spiritual growth to make frequent use of the Sacrament of Penance and attendance of daily Mass or an adult education class, prayer groups, some adoration time at the Church, or drop by the Little Store and pick up some good spiritual reading during Lent. If for some reason you need a dispensation just see one of the priests at the parish office.

**Why do we do that?
Catholic Life Explained...**

In Sunday school, the students are studying the Ten Commandments. I know that kids are important in the eyes of God, so I'm just wondering why there isn't a commandment about honoring children.

Commandments provide EOO-Equal Opportunity for Observance! They are meant for everyone, children as well as adults. There are several assumptions that would make such a commandment a bit redundant. One, children are entrusted to the care of their parents. So, respect, love, and care — as well as teaching them — are assumed to be part of the responsibility of parents. 

LENTEN RESOLUTIONS FOR MARRIED COUPLES

Are you wondering how to grow in holiness this Lent, together with your spouse? Try following some advice from the Pope! In his homilies and addresses, Pope Francis has spoken quite directly about how husband and wife should treat each other, about prayer within the family, and other ways the family lives its identify as a "domestic Church."

1. **Be courteous to your spouse.** Use polite requests: "May I? Can I?" For example, "Would you like for us to do this?" and "Do you want to go out tonight?" "To ask permission means to know how to enter with courtesy into the lives of others... True love does not impose itself harshly and aggressively."
2. **Say "thank you" to your spouse.**
3. **Ask forgiveness from your spouse.** Say, "I'm sorry."
4. **Pray together with your spouse and family.** "Praying the Our Father together, around the table, is not something extraordinary: it's easy. And praying the Rosary together, as a family, is very beautiful and a source of great strength!"
5. **Visit the elderly,** especially your grandparents.
6. **Share the faith with others.** "Christian families are missionary families... They are missionary also in everyday life, in their doing everyday things, as they bring to everything the salt and the leaven of faith!"



Lenten Disciplines of Fasting & Abstinence

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.
