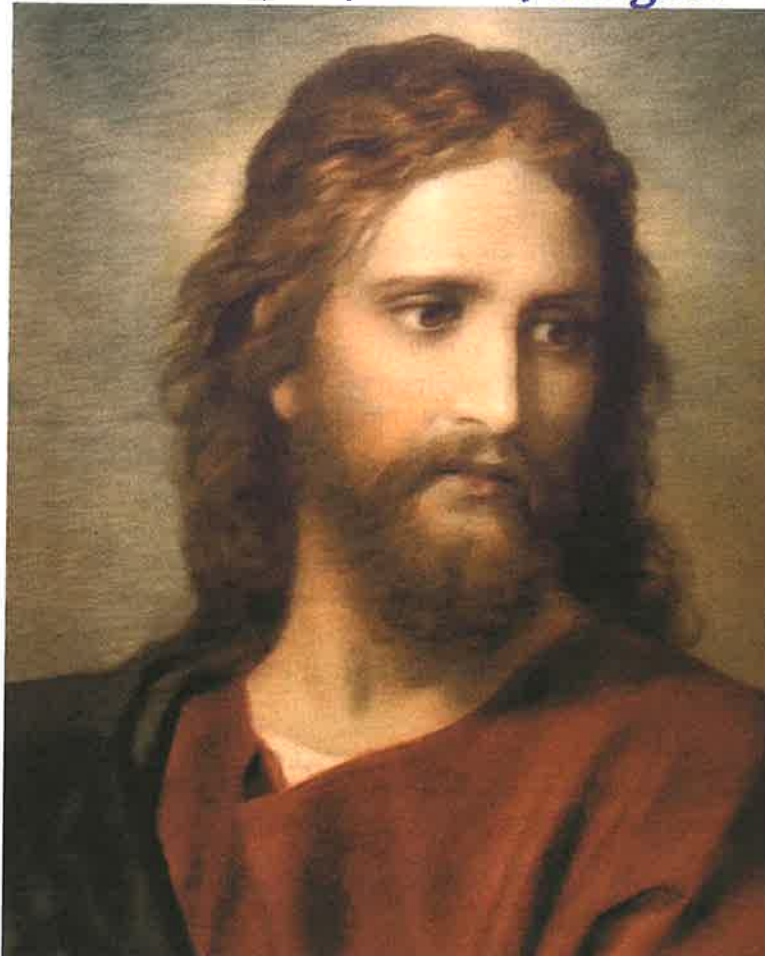

“I’m never getting enough rest! How can I possibly be ‘asleep’?” In a world of jam-packed schedules and high anxiety levels, physical rest may be hard to come by. Yet relentless pursuit of our to-do lists and social calendars may keep our minds off of the things that really matter. Jesus knows all too well a pattern of busy, harried ignorance. “In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage ... they did not know until the flood came and carried them all away ... two men will be out in the field ... two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken, and one will be left.” When it comes to the spiritual life, we can be at work or at relaxation and still be spiritually asleep.

Each year, we are called back to remember the essential things. God comes to save His people. He becomes flesh to dwell among us. Supernatural light pierces the world’s darkness and our own. Advent wakes us up. “Stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come.” Every Advent, we prepare to celebrate Christ’s first coming at Christmas, and we anticipate his second coming at the end of time.

“At an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come.” There’s another hour, too, both known and unknown. It’s the present moment. Whether it’s a lazy Saturday morning or a major business proposal, whether it’s attending a kindergarten play or an elderly relative’s bedside, at every moment the Lord wants to enter into our hearts. This Advent, let’s pray for the grace to stay alert. Christ is coming soon.

FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT

The First Sunday in Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year. It's a time of great anticipation as we await the arrival of Christ on Christmas morning. In fact, the word Advent comes from the Latin word ad-venire that means coming or arriving. **Just as in Lent**, the liturgical color of Advent is purple. Both of the seasons prepare for the great feast days in the Church year. The final days of Advent, from December 17 to December 24, focus particularly on our preparation for the celebrations of the Nativity of our Lord (Christmas).

SAINT OF THE WEEK - FRANCIS XAVIER

1506-1552

Feast Day - December 3

Known as the **Apostle** to the Indies and to Japan, Francis was born in Spanish Navarre, the youngest in a large family. He studied at the University of Paris, where he met St. Ignatius of Loyola, and was among the first seven Jesuits who vowed to be spiritual soldiers for Christ. They were ordained as a group in 1537. For 11 years, from 1541 until his untimely death after only two weeks on the Chinese coast, Francis evangelized in the east Indies, Mozambique, India, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, and Japan. A missionary prone to seasickness who had trouble learning foreign languages, Francis is the patron saint of missionaries, Borneo, the East Indies, India, Pakistan, Japan, and Outer Mongolia.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained...

What's the story behind the Advent wreath?

Each season in the liturgical calendar comes with its own local and regional rituals. During the Advent season, wreathes adorn church sanctuaries and family dining room tables. You may have said Advent wreath prayers in childhood or taken a turn lighting the candles. The Advent wreath is full of symbolism about Christ and his coming at Christmas. The wreath is made of evergreen boughs, reminding us that the life of grace doesn't falter with the changing seasons. It remains always fresh and new. Similarly, a circular wreath reminds us of the eternal, never-ending nature of God's love.

Candles remind us that Christ is the light of the world, the One who "shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." We use four candles to represent each week of Advent. Traditionally they come in the liturgical colors of the season. Purple has historically represented penance and sacrifice. We see the same color for the season of Lent. On the third Sunday of Advent, however, we light a rose color. The priest will wear rose vestments at Mass. This is Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin. On the third Sunday of Advent, we're roughly halfway through the season. The Church chooses the midpoint to remind us to celebrate in the midst of our anticipation! Whatever the color and whatever the day, the Advent wreath is a beautiful practice to focus our attention on Christ's coming at Christmas.

The next book that I will review is *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist*. This book was written by one of the newest Catholic authors we are familiar with, Brant Pitre, whose book *The Case For Jesus* we have recently read. You can get a copy of *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist* through Amazon or the Augustine Institute.

Fr. Ray's Book Review

Brant began the introduction with a story of meeting a Baptist minister to officiate his wedding. The lady he was going to marry was a Baptist, but during the meeting the minister attacked Brant for the Catholic teachings that he believed, but especially the teachings concerning the Eucharist. As Catholics, we believe that during the consecration at Mass that although the appearances of bread and wine remain, the reality is that there is no more bread and wine, there is only Jesus: his body, his blood, his soul and his divinity. This is what we call the Real Presence in the Eucharist.

Later that night Brant became more upset because he realized that the minister was mocking the Real Presence of Jesus. At first Brant turned to Scripture to defend the Churches teaching. He discovered the answer the he was looking for in John Chapter 6. However, Brant knew that not everyone looked at this chapter as Catholics did. Going deeper he looked at what ancient Judaism would say about the Last Supper. Pope Benedict himself once wrote: "It must be said that the message of Jesus is completely misunderstood if it is separated from the context of the faith and hope of the Chosen People...Jesus above all addresses Israel, in order to gather it together in the eschatological time that arrived with him."

Brant hoped to show in this book that by focusing on the Jewish context of Jesus' teachings, all of his words not only begin to make sense; they come alive in a way that is exciting and powerful.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP**Wide-Open Eyes**

When my first child was born, we had a nursery created for him that featured images from "The Beginner's Bible" painted on all the walls. (You may have seen this Bible before, where the Biblical figures in the book all had large wide-open eyes.) Images of Adam and Eve, David and Goliath, and Jesus were displayed on all four walls. On the largest wall was a big picture of Noah's Ark with lots of animals. As our son got older, we would point to images on the wall as we read bedtime stories to him. Our son is now in his 20's and living several hours from us, so those days are far behind in our rear-view mirror of life.

We prepared quite a lot for his birth. When our next two children were born, the preparation time had decreased significantly. Most parents know what I am talking about. The newness of your first-born brings with it so much emotion that you are compelled to spend countless hours preparing. When the next children are born, you are certainly excited, but you act differently and with a little more reserve.

For most readers, this is not your first Advent. It probably won't be your last. If you approach these December days simply as a way to prepare for Christmas, you may find yourself just doing the same old thing as last year. However, if you spend this time reflecting on the time when Jesus returns or when you shall see him face-to-face, you might be able to stir up some of that emotion of anticipation within you. Jesus is coming again. When people of all ages understand that reality, it can be a cause for large, wide-open eyes indeed.
