## 4<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY OF ADVENT

“She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.”

- Mt 1:21

Each Advent season, we prepare to welcome Jesus into the inns and stables of our hearts. But Jesus' coming wasn't welcomed by everyone with choirs of angels. For St. Joseph, the first coming of Jesus was a bit more complicated. "When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit." For Joseph, opening his heart (and home) to Jesus meant, at best, appearing to all the world like a man who had impregnated his wife out of wedlock. At worst, he appeared a cuckold, raising the child of another man. God doesn't always appear the way we expect.

For some of us, the birth of Christ is a bit relationally complicated. Perhaps over the past few months, a loved one has died. This Christmas, you're taking it upon yourself to keep up the traditions and hold the family together. Welcoming Jesus means welcoming grief. Perhaps it's a difficult relative (or two or three) and it's all you can do to bite your tongue and swallow your pride while they're under your roof. Welcoming Jesus means welcoming strife, discord, and tension.

Yet "do not be afraid," the angel says. Do not be afraid. Why? Because we celebrate the birth of "Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us.'" Before Jesus' earthly ministry would begin, Jesus would lose his father, Joseph. God is with us in our grief. Wherever Jesus went, he stirred up controversy and faced down challenging personalities. God is with us in our stress. The trick is, like Joseph, to allow supernatural grace to prevail. Joseph was a good man, filled with natural virtue in that he didn't want to "expose [Mary] to shame." Yet he was prepared to "divorce her quietly" all the same. Our natural abilities only take us so far. Where is receiving Jesus complicated this Christmas season? Are you relying on your own strength to get you through, or are you truly ready to accept the grace of Emmanuel, God with us?

Fr. Ray's  
Book Review

In Chapter 3 we look at "The New Passover." The people of Israel were waiting for a new exodus and you cannot have an exodus without the Passover. At the Last Supper Jesus spoke of his future suffering and death and he identified the bread and the wine of the supper as his own body and blood and commanded the disciples to eat and drink. In doing this he established the long awaited New Passover.

Jesus ate the Passover Meal in Jerusalem according to Jewish tradition. Yet Jesus made some changes that had to have been noticed by the disciples. First of all, a Passover Meal was to be celebrated within a family setting with the father taking the leadership position. Here Jesus led the Passover Meal and the disciples were present. Secondly Jesus shifted the focus away from the body and the blood of the Passover Lamb and turned it toward his own body and blood. Jesus was revealing to them the New Passover of the Messiah, and then like the previous Passover Meal, Jesus commanded the apostles to "Do this in remembrance of me."

It was estimated that during every Passover around 200,000 lambs were sacrificed. All of this came to an end when the Romans destroyed Jerusalem in 70 A.D. Jesus' command to do this in his memory took the place of the sacrificial lamb and has been continuously celebrated around the world today.

During the days of Jesus not only did you have to kill the lamb, using two sticks that looked like a cross, but you also had to eat the lamb. Only members of the covenant were allowed to participate in the sacrifice. Now Jesus himself became the lamb of sacrifice and the blood of redemption is the blood of the Messiah. The Eucharist is a real participation in both the Last Supper and the death or exodus of Jesus.

### Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained...

**I can't explain it. I feel a nudge from God to do something out of the ordinary. How do I respond?**

You're in good company! Abraham was asked to leave all he knew and loved for a strange land, with only abstract divine assurance that such a sacrifice would be worth it. Plenty of prophets protested against God's call, whether it was claiming they were too young (Jeremiah) or running away entirely, only to end up in a whale's belly (Jonah). St. Joseph was asked to do something very strange. He was asked to believe — on the word of an angelic appearance in a dream — that his betrothed was pregnant not from another man, but by a miraculous inter-

vention of God. Then he was called to marry her. Author Flannery O'Connor once wrote, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you odd." Sometimes God's invitation might seem strange or challenging. It might require sacrifices we never expected to make. Our life might look different than we had always imagined. But as we all know, life throws its own curveballs, regardless of whether or not we're listening for God's will. Better, one would think, to be open to the promptings of God and to follow along the strange trails that they lead. We have the assurance that, eventually, we will find green pastures.

I did not end up being the great parent I had hoped I would be. I was afraid of decisions I had to make and the possible repercussions. At times, I was afraid that I was not strong enough to lead my family. The fear occasionally led me toward inaction or eventual mistakes. The only thing that got me through the tough times and allowed me to see it was okay was Jesus. Without Jesus, I would never have been half of the father and husband I have been through the years.

When we try to tackle life alone, we can find ourselves in a very lonely position. Just like Jesus' parents, we need God to assist us and provide us with the strength for what lies ahead. Joseph needed God to be with him as he took Mary as his wife and became a father. Every parent needs God to become more than they can be on their own.

How do you treat those who you love? Who is there to help you when a relationship faces an obstacle? We are called to love others as our Father in heaven loves us. That is really an unreachable goal. Yet with God, all things are possible. As this Advent ends, may your Christmas be about more than presents and decorations. May the most profound gifts you give and receive be that of each other, and may your lives be decorated with the fruits of that love.

**SAINT OF THE WEEK****St. Stephen, First Martyr****First Century****Feast Day - December 26**

Christianity's first martyr was probably a Greek Jew. Stephen's story is recounted in the Acts of the Apostles. He was among the first seven deacons chosen to serve the Hellenist Christian community in Jerusalem. But the wonders he worked rattled local Jewish leaders. Witnesses at his trial before the Sanhedrin gave false testimony, and Stephen defended himself with a stirring speech recalling the long history of Israel's relationship with God and calling the Jews "stiff-necked people" who "always oppose the Holy Spirit." As he was stoned to death outside the city, he cried out, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." He is the patron of bricklayers, stonemasons and numerous individual Christian churches.

*"Just as Jesus on the Cross entrusted himself to the Father without reserve and pardoned those who killed him, at the moment of his death St Stephen prayed: "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit"; and further: "Lord, do not hold this sin against them" (cf. Acts 7: 59-60). Stephen was a genuine disciple of Jesus and imitated him perfectly. With Stephen began that long series of martyrs who sealed their faith by offering their lives, proclaiming with their heroic witness that God became man to open the Kingdom of Heaven to humankind."*
