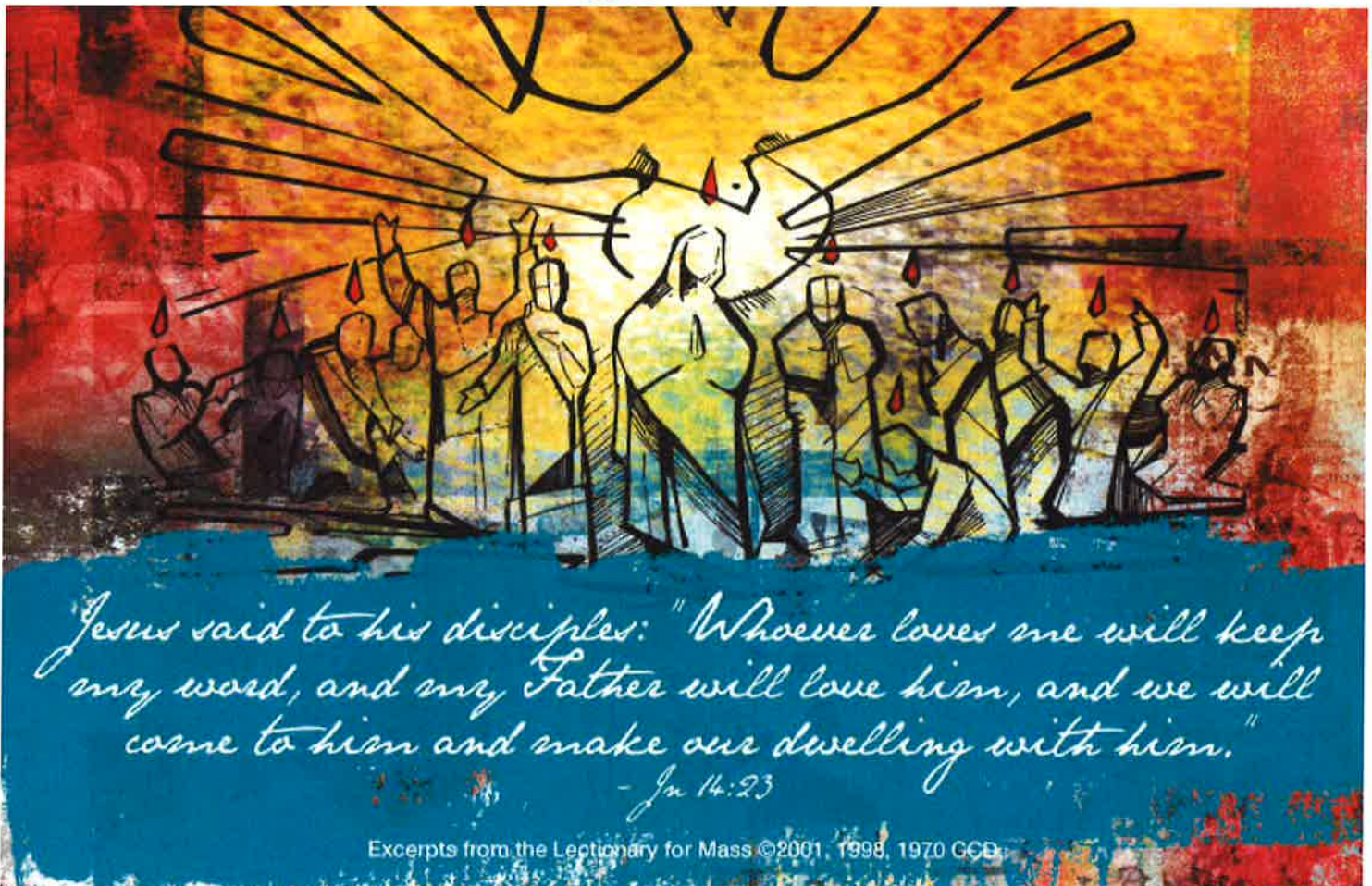

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 GCD

Pentecost Sunday "God is always more." Have you ever heard that? If we truly believe that He is infinite, then this statement is worth exploring. Today, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit in power upon the early Church. But Pentecost wasn't the first time the disciples received the Holy Spirit. The Gospel actually occurs chronologically before Pentecost. Soon after the Resurrection, Jesus already "came and stood in their [the disciples'] midst... he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.'"

God is always more. Sometimes we might think the grace of God as one and done. God might break through in people's lives, but it's a one-time event on a retreat or preceding a dramatic conversion of life. But there's always more to come. Even today's Gospel isn't the first time the breath of God stirred. In Genesis, it's God's breath that stirs life into Adam in the garden. Jesus breathes on the Apostles, giving them the Holy Spirit in the quiet and silence. Later, that breath will stir into a "driving wind", and the Spirit will descend with flame? not unlike Moses on Mount Sinai. God is always more. He has spoken throughout salvation history, and continues to speak into our lives through His Church and through the Holy Spirit alive in our hearts. This Pentecost Sunday, let us come before Him with expectant hearts! Like the disciples in the Gospel and first reading, let us await what "more" God will do.

Fr. Ray's Book Review

Chapter 11 begins with a quote from St. Josemaria Escriva: "You lack drive. That is why you sway so few." After that a story is told about a statue in a Church in Muster, Germany that was destroyed by bombing. The statue of Jesus had lost its arms and the people of the parish put up a sign by the statue, "I have no arms but yours."

A Christian produces the fruits God expects from them if they have personal holiness and are in union with the Lord. But no one can give what he does not have. A Christian is born from great love for Christ. We do not need to depend so much on our own talents, attractiveness, speaking or writing ability. It all comes down to how much you love the Lord.

So what has happened that we Christians today seem at times to convince so few? The faith is the same. Christ lives among us. The hand of God has not grown weaker. Can it be that whole nations have fallen into lukewarmness?

Lukewarmness has taken away the strength and fortitude of faith. It has led individuals and crowds to compromise and to take the easy way. For the early Christians, the norm of everyday was heroism. Faith mattered more than life itself. When love grows cold and faith falls asleep, the yeast has lost its power. The reason for failure in the apostolate can often be found in lukewarmness and spiritual mediocrity.

Love is the motor driving saint's lives. Love supplies ways to surmount any problem. Love transforms the soul and gives it new ideas. As we struggle daily to become saints, God will make us into instruments that can work miracles. If Christians doze off into lukewarmness, society will soon start to rot.

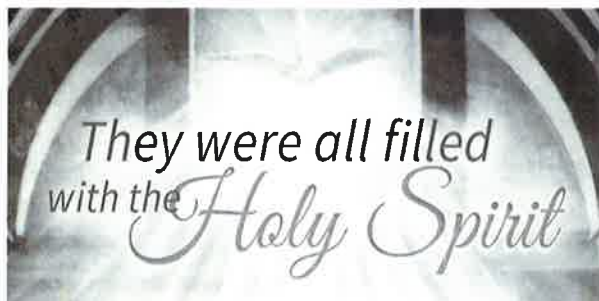

PRAYING WITH BODY, MIND, AND VOICE

Kneeling In the early Church, kneeling signified penance. So thoroughly was kneeling identified with penance that the early Christians were forbidden to kneel on Sundays and during the Easter season, when the prevailing spirit of the Liturgy was one of joy and thanksgiving. In the Middle Ages kneeling came to signify homage, and more recently this posture has come to signify adoration, especially before the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is for this reason that the bishops of this country have chosen the posture of kneeling for the entire Eucharistic Prayer.

Catholic Life Explained...**

Why do we celebrate Pentecost when we do?

The book of Acts unpacks the events immediately following Jesus' ascension into heaven. The Apostles and other disciples were told to pray in Jerusalem and await another outpouring of the Holy Spirit. As the weeks ticked on, the Jewish Festival of Weeks approached. This festival took place 50 days after Passover and celebrated the giving of the law on Mount Sinai. The Festival of Weeks (or "Pentecost" in Greek) was a great pilgrimage feast, with Jews from all over the ancient world convening on Jerusalem for the celebration.

It was on Pentecost that God chose to send the Holy Spirit. Here, the new law of love was etched into the hearts of the disciples. As he burst out onto the balcony above the multinational crowd, Peter proclaimed the message of the resurrection, and the Holy Spirit enabled every listener to hear in their native language. 3,000 people were baptized that day! The disciples - and every baptized person - receives the gifts and zeal necessary to bring a new message of salvation to the people of God.
