3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

“This is the one about whom it is written: Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you.” - Mt 11:10

Who did you come to see? A version of this question is posed by Jesus many times in the Gospels. He asks it of Andrew and John when they begin to follow him. He asks it of Mary Magdalene in the garden of the resurrection. He asks it in today's Gospel. "What did you go out to the desert to see?" There is something innately human about "seeing." Animals have eyes — some with much more powerful vision than our own — but that's not the kind of seeing Jesus is talking about. We could phrase the question several other ways. "What are you looking for?" "What are you longing for?" "Whom do you seek?"

It is in seeing for ourselves that our suspicions or hypotheses are confirmed, that our desires discover their fulfillment, and that we can rest for a moment in certainty. John the Baptist sought certainty of Jesus' identity. "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" Jesus sends word to him based on the testimony of sight, observations of the mighty deeds Jesus has begun to work. "Go and tell John what you hear and see."

God recognizes our desire to see. In the Incarnation, the Word is made flesh. The invisible is made visible. The supernatural is made manifest in an infant who can do little more than the most natural of movements as he feeds, cries, sleeps. We don't need to wait for Christmas to see God. The work of God is all around us. Those blinded by sin "regain their sight." People overcome backgrounds of poverty and violence to make world-changing contributions. Addicts grow and heal. Truth is spoken, and people listen. Let's pray for the grace to see God's movement in our lives this week. How have you seen the work of God?

 Book Review

In Chapter 2 we look at who the Jewish people were waiting for. While a few Jewish, such as the Zealots, were waiting for a political Messiah, most Jews were looking for a Messiah that would restore Israel in a new exodus. They longed for the day that God would save his people in much the same way that God saved his people during the flight from Egypt. The Old Testament prophets had foretold the coming of a new Moses; the making of a new covenant; the building of a new Temple; and the journey to a new promised land. In particular Brant said that the new Exodus will provide us with three primary keys for unlocking the mystery of the Last Supper: the Passover, the Manna, and the Bread of Presence.

In the first exodus God saved the people of Israel by sending Moses. Eventually the Assyrian army, later on the Babylonian army will destroy the Promised Land. God had promised through the prophets that he will raise up for them a prophet like Moses from among their brethren. It was said the Moses took his wife and his sons, and set them upon an ass as they were leaving Egypt. Similarly, the promised Redeemer would come into Jerusalem lowly and riding upon an ass.

In the first exodus God made a covenant between himself and the people of Israel, and sealed the covenant with the blood of an animal sacrifice, thus making Israel his own flesh and blood. Jeremiah promised in chapter 31 that God would make a new covenant with the people of Israel. They believed that this new covenant could only come about at the end of time. Instead the promise spoken of by Jeremiah was fulfilled at the Last Supper. All of the writings of the Jewish faith say that the new Messiah would build a new Temple, which Jesus accomplished with his resurrection.

Jesus began his ministry in the desert with 40 days of fasting; he ended his ministry in the upper room on Passover. His many miracles are the signs of the new exodus spoken of by Isaiah. The journey would take all of God's children to a new Promised Land and New Jerusalem, in heaven, the world to come.

2020 SAINT DEVOTION

"What better fruit of love is there than imitation?" asked St. Augustine. "The bridge did not collapse after the saints had crossed over it, nor did the fountain of graces dry up when they had drunk from it!" December brings us to the conclusion of our 2019 Saint Walk Devotion. Before picking the holy card of the new saint who will walk you through 2020, let us not forget to give thanks to our 2019 saint companion. Where do you recognize his/her fresh footsteps on your spiritual path? As the saints tell us, "Small beginnings are not to be despised!

This Saint Walk Devotion actually was developed by St. Francis de Sales. He put the names of saints into a basket, then directed the nuns to pick a saint card. He then instructed the sisters to imitate that saint's virtues throughout the year. The Catholic Church begun in, with, and through our Lord Jesus Christ, has in it a timeline that has always followed her saints. "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ," said St. Paul to the Corinthians. Therefore, let us by our Saint Walk Devotion, imitate those imitators of Jesus Christ, the saints!!

THIS WEEK IN THE GOSPEL...

In the Gospels this week, we hear about Mary visiting her kinswoman Elizabeth. Elizabeth was much older than Mary and it was a miracle she had also conceived a baby. Elizabeth and her husband Zechariah were parents of John the Baptist. Unlike Mary, Zechariah did not believe when an angel revealed to him that his wife would bear a son and name him John. When he doesn't believe the angel, he is struck dumb until he confirms the name John at his son's circumcision. Elizabeth is the patron saint of pregnant women and infertile couples. "Zechariah's doubts and his need for explanations contrast with the 'yes' of Mary, who asks only to know how everything spoken to her was to come about. Zechariah could not overcome his desire to control everything; he could not abandon the mindset of someone needing to be responsible for making things happen. Mary did not hesitate or think about herself: instead, she surrendered herself; she trusted."
